





Empowering God's Children

Together with Catholic parishes throughout the U.S. and assisted by the National Catholic Risk Retention Group's "Virtus" program which we already use to train all adult staffers and volunteers in safe environment practices, Our Lady Star of the Sea Parish is partnering with our parents to present safe environment lessons to our youth. These lessons are an integral part of our Religious Education program, but are also available to all families of the Parish. As adults, we cherish every opportunity to protect children. Part of that protection is to teach children how to safely interact with others. This year our children will experience two of six recurrent lessons. This year's themes are: safe and unsafe interactions with others; and knowing who are the safe adults to whom they can turn for help if needed.

The hour-long lessons are age-appropriate for our various students and are scheduled for Tuesday, <u>April 30th at either 3:00 in the afternoon or at 6:00</u> o'clock in the evening.

OUR LADY STAR OF THE SEA PARISH Marblehead, Massachusetts

April 28, 2024 Fifth Sunday of Easter

Dear Parishioner of Our Lady Star of the Sea,

This Sunday we have readings that picture the strength of new life which is ours in Christ Jesus. The first reading (see Acts 9:26-31) speaks of a church community at peace, being built up by walking in the fear of the Lord with the consolation of the Holy Spirit. We pray for as much for our community, our nation and our world. Such graces can be ours only when we are in true union with our Lord and with one another in the Lord.

"Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit." The theme of remaining in Jesus is the important thought for our hearts. Often, when we pray over this image of the vine and the branches we think of it as one of the many parables from the Lord's teaching and public life. Actually, in John's Gospel, it functions otherwise. It is part of the Lord's words to the disciples at the Last Supper. They are about to witness the Lord being "cut off" by his betrayal, unjust condemnation and execution by the power of the state. How are they to understand it? Jesus strives to help them understand it as a kind of pruning by which even greater fruit is assured, greater life is to be given.

Too often in considering the image of vine and branches, we think of what is cut off and thrown away. What is thrown away is not the center or purpose of the action. The pruning is for the sake of the vine, for the sake of what remains. Thus is the vine strengthened. Just as Jesus remains in the Father and carries on in his love, so will he be pruned by the vine-grower not to be cast away as a lost branch but to remain as the main plant, the original stock rooted in the Father's love. Indeed, the pruning will lead to new growth and a new life for the world and for each of us.

For us disciples, too, there will be many moments of apparent loss in the journey of life. Things we may have thought of as absolutely essential are cut away. The loss of loved ones comes to mind. The compromise to one's health is another. The pain of a broken relationship may be a third. In such moments, we may be so taken by the sense of loss, that we ourselves are cut off from hope and are burned by the bad experience. Especially in these moments, the Lord asks us to remain firm in the Father's love by remaining, abiding with him, Jesus. Look at what happened to him. His passion was not a victory for sin and death but turned out to be the victory of God's saving love bringing new life to the world. So too in the apparent losses of life. Be on the Jesus side of the cut. If we remain true to Christ and his ways, if we trust in the Father's goodness especially in our moment of trial we will not, in fact, be cut off, but enabled with new, stronger powers of realizing God's goodness and peace.

With St. John in the Second Reading (see 1 John 3:18-24) we "have confidence in God." "The way we know that he remains in us is from the Spirit he gave us." Let us pray for the grace to confront the apparent losses in life with that same confidence in God's love. If we remain true to that love we, too, will see the fruits of God's love increase in and through us for the sake of the world.

I am looking forward to our Retreat Day with our First Communion Candidates this coming Saturday. Entering communion with the Lord and remaining in the bond of friendship with him is a grace and a strength that will enrich their lives and assure their happiness. Please pray for them and their families in these final weeks of preparation.

We hope to see you at this community wide event.



Comments from Deacon Joe Eastertide Continues


<u>Review/Preview</u> We are more than halfway through the Easter Season. It might be good to look back at what we've seen and look ahead to what's still to come as we rejoice. The Sunday gospels have told us of the empty tomb of Jesus, of his appearances to the Apostles and



his opening their hearts to understand the scriptures. Then we heard of Jesus proclaiming himself the good shepherd. Today we hear that we are branches on the lifegiving vine which he is. Still to come, we will hear his command of love, we will celebrate his ascension and we will hear of his prayer to the Father for his followers. Eastertide concludes with Pentecost, the descent of the Holy Spirit on the Apostles.

Meanwhile at daily Mass we have heard from the Gospel of John about Jesus meeting with Nicodemus (the call to be born of water and the Holy Spirit), Jesus the Bread of Life who feeds us with his Body and Blood, and Jesus the light of the world. We've reached chaper 14 and will now hear of the Last Supper: Jesus teaching his disciples and praying to the Father for them and us. In Acts of the Apostles we're also in chapter 14. We have already heard of the early days of the Church in Jerusalem and the beginning of persecutions and the first spread of the gospel to the Gentiles. Now the focus will be on the evangelizing work of St. Paul. "The Word Among Us," available in the church, gives the readings for each day as well as a meditation on one of them. You can take a copy and use it to follow along at home, or you can just read in your Bible if you'd like to pray with the Church in this way.

birthday, St. Anselm College has a reading Happy Eastertide! of his 154 sonnets. I participated this year for my second time and read Sonnet 77. I was also pleased to be part of the awarding of the second annual John S.
