

Part of that protection is to teach children how to safely interact with others. This year our children will experience two of six recurrent lessons. This year's themes are: safe and unsafe interactions with others; and knowing who are the safe adults to whom they can turn for help if needed.

The hour-long lessons are age-appropriate for our various students and are scheduled for Tuesday, April 30th at either 3:00 in the afternoon or at 6:00 o'clock in the evening.

April 7, 2024 Sunday of Divine Mercy

Dear Parishioner of Our Lady Star of the Sea,

Mercy and peace! The Gospel for this weekend (see John 20:19-31), takes place on the first day of the week and on the 8th day, one week after the Resurrection. We pray it, always today, the eighth day, one week after Easter. The Gospel describes the quintessential Easter experience: an encounter with the Risen Lord who bestows his mercy and peace. "Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, 'Peace be with you." Even though the Apostles had abandoned their Lord and had closed themselves off in fear, he comes to them in love, not to condemn but to save.

The Gospel account is carefully structured and presented. There are two encounters, one with and one without the figure of Thomas present. In the first encounter, Jesus speaks to the whole Church, in the person of his disciples, with his gifts of the Holy Spirit and of mission: bringing mercy, forgiveness and peace in his name to the world. The second encounter, that of the 8th Day, is directed entirely to Thomas, who wasn't present at that first encounter. He is called to faith, exclaiming: "My Lord and my God!" He is called to that faith through his encounter with the wounds of Jesus: Jesus knew the words of Thomas' doubt expressed to the disciples days earlier. In showing Thomas his physical wounds, Jesus shares as well the wound of his heart over Thomas' hesitation. Jesus shows his hands and his side, his pierced heart. Jesus invites Thomas to touch and to probe deeply.

Mercy Sunday is directed entirely to you and to me. We, like Thomas, were not present on that first, first day of the week, the day of the resurrection. We are among those who have not seen (that day) and have believed. And we come to belief in the Resurrection of the Lord in the same way that Thomas did: through an encounter with the wounds of Jesus.

Through the mystery of his cross, Jesus won forgiveness and life for the world. Through the mystery of the cross, Jesus embraced the wounds that sin and death have inflicted on and within our human family. Through the mystery of the cross, Jesus has made the wounds of humanity his very own. Now he turns to you, as he did to Thomas, and invites you to touch and to probe deeply those wounds manifest in this, the eighth day, today. Jesus embraced and made his own the wounds of the sick, the lost, the rejected, the forgotten, the hungry and frightened victims of war and of violence, even those of the evildoers who inflict wounds on him and on others. He did so, so as to confront you with his own wounds today, our eighth day. He did so, so as to invite you to see and to believe in him as your Lord and your God brutally present today. He did so, so as to call you to mercy and to peace, inescapably, so that you may be mercy and peace in our world today.

The mercy of which this "Sunday of Mercy" speaks is often thought of as the mercy we received from God that first Easter. And so it is. But that mercy is not a "thing" to be had. Rather, for us it is a gift of the eighth day, today. Jesus calls us, as he did Thomas, to confront the wounds painfully present in our own day that are the wounds of Christ himself, made his own on the cross. He invites you to let your heart touch and probe the depths of love. "Be not unbelieving but believe." This is the meaning of Divine Mercy. You are invited to a communion of mind and heart with Christ Jesus. As he was sent, so does he send you. Through the Works of Mercy, both Corporal and Spiritual, you are confronted with the wounds that belong to Jesus. As you deal with hunger, thirst, sickness, exposure, human failure, ignorance, stubbornness, violence and pains of so many sorts, Jesus asks you to do so for him. It is in the recognition, born of a communion of mind and heart with Jesus as he gives his very life to those who suffer most, that you can come to truly believe in the One whom God has raised from the dead.

Asking God's blessing on you, and your loved ones for a worthy celebration of this Mercy Sunday and our Easter Season, I am

Comments from Deacon Joe

Annunciation

In the Church calendar March 25 is the date for the



Solemnity of the Annunciation. This year, that happened to be the Monday of Holy Week, and no other celebration can take place during Holy Week and the Octave of Easter. When a Solemnity can't be celebrated on its own day, it is transferred to the next available day, which in this case is tomorrow, April 8.

The Annunciation is a very important celebration, because it is a very important event. While the gospel may seem to focus on Mary — and certainly the large window in our church shows her in the center with Gabriel to the side — it is really the Incarnation — God the Son becoming human — that is most important. Without the Incarnation, there is no birth of Jesus (Christmas). Easter is more important, and the Incarnation was to make it possible, but this is still one of the biggest feasts of the year: the beginning of our salvation https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/ Annunciation.

The *Angelus* is a traditional prayer honoring the Annunciation/Incarnation. It goes "V. The angel of the Lord declared unto Mary. / R. And she conceived by the Holy Spirit./ Hail Mary.../ V. Behold the handmaid of the Lord. / R. Be it done unto me according to thy word./ Hail Mary.../ V. And the Word



was made flesh/R. and dwelt among us./ V. Pray for us, O holy Mother of God, / R. that we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ./ Pour forth, we beseech thee, O Lord, thy grace into our hearts that we, to whom the Incarnation of Christ thy Son was made known by the message of an angel, may by his Passion and Cross be brought to the glory of his Resurrection. Through the same Christ Our Lord. Amen." It was traditionally prayed three times a day: 6 a.m., 12 noon, and 6 p.m. Church bells were rung at those times in a pattern of 3, 3, 3, 9. Many places, including our church, still ring the bells at those

Biographies of the great 19th century Austrian composer Anton Bruckner tell that when he was teaching in the conservatory in Vienna, if he heard the Angelus bells, he would stop his lecture, kneel down, and pray the Angelus before resuming (much to the amazement of his "sophisticated" students).



I gave the wording I learned at Star of the Sea School. You may be able to find the prayer on line in updated language; but whatever wording you use, it could be good to pray the Angelus, if not three times a day, at least when you have a chance, perhaps when you hear the Angelus bells.

This week in addition to the Solemnity of the Annunciation on Monday, we celebrate the Memorial of St. Stanislaus, bishop of Cracow, who was martyred by king Boleslaus in 1079 https://en.wikipedia.org/ wiki/Stanislaus of Szczepanów.
