

Dear Parishioner of Our Lady Star of the Sea,

"Peace be with you!" The heart of our prayer this Third Sunday of the Easter Season is this Easter greeting of the Lord to the disciples (see Luke 24:35-48). That which the earliest followers of the Lord most remembered about that first Easter was this greeting of peace. The risen Lord spoke "Peace!" to them who had denied and abandoned him at his time of need. It was the greeting that he has first taught to them when he first sent them to preach and to heal, saying that they must make it their first word upon entering any home. Now as the Risen Lord comes into their presence he greets them with the peace that only his victory over all sin and death can give.

Indeed, the Gospel proclaims that "repentance, for the forgiveness of sins would be preached in his name." In saying so, not only does the Lord prepare his disciples for their mission as "witnesses of these things," he indicates the kind of thing about which they are to witness: our new life through forgiveness. None of the many stories of the disciples' first encounters with the risen Lord actually describe the exit of Jesus from the enclosure of his tomb. They do describe his encounter with his own and his giving of peace, forgiveness, power and joy to each and every one of them. By contrast, all and each of the stories of the disciples' first encounters with the risen Lord, describe *their exit from the tomb*. They exit the confusion of shame and guilt, that of ignorance and fear in which they were entombed. They are to describe your exit from the same sepulchral constraints.

Indeed, it is in the company of Jesus, and by the power of his word of peace that you step out and into the light. By the convincing bodily encounter with him in the sacraments you and I are led out of the tomb and begin to live. We are led out of murky confusion to the clarity of a new day. We are led out of the darkness of ignorance to the light of knowledge and understanding. We are led out of the constrictions of fear to the bright joy of new life in him. Easter begins in the bodily resurrection of Jesus, conqueror over sin and death. Easter continues in your bodily resurrection as you are called by the Lord as a living witness, speaking peace, forgiveness, power and joy to each and every one. Now. Bodily. Forever.

Peace. Certainly, this weekend we must renew our prayers to the risen Lord that he continue to bestow his gifts of peace on our world. We pray for the end of all recourse to violence, to today's weapons of great destruction or to any other means by which harm is indiscriminately visited upon others. We pray for restraint and good judgment by all parties throughout the disturbed areas of so many parts of our world today. Violence does not end violence. War does not end war. Only hearts renewed from on high and a sincere and definitive commitment of intellect and will to the service of the good can assure the peace that is so needed.

We must do all we can to come alive to God's goodness in our own lives. We must be witnesses that the works of our common life as a society be kept free from the imprisoning darkness of sin, with all the ignorance, fear and confusion it engenders. We must let the words of the Risen One and the gifts of forgiveness and life he imparts to help us leave behind the old ways of the tomb and to reach out preferably for the things of heaven. Now. Bodily. Forever.

We pray for a happy and safe Spring vacation for all our students.

The date for our next Confirmation has been set for November 3, 2024.


