

April 16, 2023 Second Sunday of Easter / Divine Mercy Sunday

Dear Parishioner of Our Lady Star of the Sea,

A Blessed Divine Mercy Sunday one and all! This Octave of Easter is a wonderful opportunity to express our gratitude to the Lord for the way his graces brought so many of our parish family together this Easter. May we continue in that joy.

"Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who in his great mercy gave us new birth to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead." We who have known the mercy of God's love through Jesus Christ are, by the Lord, sent forth to bring the new life of the Gospel to the whole world. In today's Gospel (see John 20:19-31), Jesus greets guilty, fearful and unbelieving disciples in a gesture of great mercy: "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me so I send you." New Life begins in the mercy of God and, by God's grace, the readiness of our hearts to reflect, to correspond and to come alive in that mercy. May each of you know the loving mercy of God in your lives and, in the peace that Jesus imparts, may you extend gifts of life and hope to all you meet.

We come to know the "reality" of this new life through its thorough exercise. The figure of St. Thomas the Doubtful is so important to the Easter story. He was initially willing to believe in Jesus' victory but only in accord with his own criteria: if Jesus were to do as he, Thomas, says, then he would believe. Jesus shows himself more than willing to comply as he appears a second time and invites Thomas to probe his wounds and to convince himself of his actual presence as the Risen One. Thomas, however, does not, in the end, reach out in that way. Indeed, Thomas realizes that no amount of worldly exploration and physical proof are adequate to the reality here to be verified. Much more is needed to recognize Jesus, "my Lord and my God."

Thomas, indeed every believer, is invited to do more than probe a finger here or there. Who will be shown mercy? It is the merciful. We are invited to enter in, to take up and fully to "put on" Christ, knowing that then do we truly come to know the reality and power of Him who has risen from the grave. Be sent as he was sent. Forgive as he forgives. Bestow peace as God gives peace. Give life in his name as he has given us life. These are the Gospel ways of Easter faith. You and I and each and every generation of believers are invited to live the life of Christ. The first and second readings tell us: "Many signs and wonders were done among the people" (see Acts 5:12-16); "I... share with you the distress, the kingdom, and the endurance we have in Jesus" (see Revelation 1:9-11a, 12-13, 17-19). May you be powerfully taken up in the mission of mercy, reconciliation and peace given you by the Lord Jesus and thereby come to know the surpassing power of the Living One who has called you.

Gratitude goes, on behalf of the Parish, to all those who worked so hard for our Lent and Easter celebrations. Special mention go to our Music Ministries, our other Liturgical Ministers and to those who decorate and prepare the Church and grounds for our Prayer. We join in recognition, too, of all those memorialized in our Easter Flower Memorial this year.

During this coming May, I will schedule opportunities for general Parish meetings, now that our community has truly begun to come alive again after our Covid-19 and other challenges. Together we will look at our pastoral and financial state of health. Together will set our next priorities for our mission and for the care and strengthening of our families and community.

<u>Comments from Deacon Joe</u> Eastertide Continues

Divine Mercy Sunday today completes the Octave of Easter, the most festive week of the seven weeks of Eastertide. We still have six weeks more of the Easter season, though. At Mass, the white vestments will remind us that we are still in a heightened celebration of the the Lord's resurrection, as will the readings that are proclaimed from now through Pentecost.

At daily Mass, the first reading will be from the Acts of the Apostles. If you can't get to Mass on weekdays, you might want to read Acts prayerfully on your own between now and Pentecost. There are 28 chapters in the book, so at an average rate of two chapters every three days, you can read it all during this season. You can reflect on the early days of the Church and pray about what it has to tell us about our lives in the present, as we in our turn seek to make Christ known to the world, not just as a figure in history, but as our Savior.

I may have misled some of you. I have been reliably informed that the profound bow I've been making when receiving Communion is wrong. Only a bow of the head is called for at that moment. I was wrong, I regret.

So if any of you have been imitating me at that point, you may dispense with the profound bow and just make a bow of your head to acknowledge the presence of Jesus in the sacrament.

What is important is that we continue to have the spirit of amazement at the fact that the saving death and resurrection of Jesus are happening before our eyes at every Mass, as Pope Francis reminds us.

This week every day is a weekday of Eastertide except for the optional memorial of St. Anselm of Canterbury, bishop and Doctor of the Church on April 21. Anselm was born in 933 or 934 in Aosta, which was part of Burgundy at the time. (Interestingly for Marbleheaders, Aosta's flag is plain red and black.) He was a Benedictine monk, eventually becoming abbot of Bec in France, and from 1093 to 1109 Archbishop of Canterbury. Anselm was the greatest theologian and philosopher of the Catholic Church during the period between St. Augustine and St. Thomas Aquinas. He spoke of his studies as "faith seeking understanding," which is a good attitude for us all. <u>https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Anselm of Canterbury</u>
