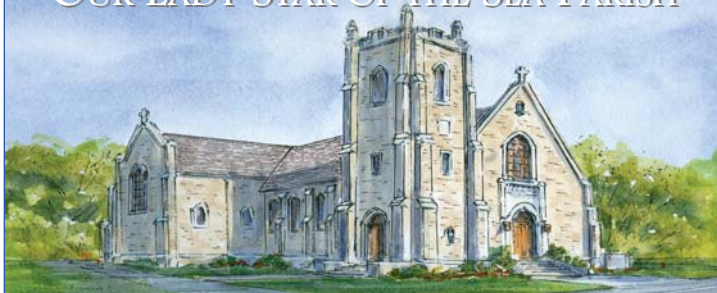

Dear Parishioner of Our Lady Star of the Sea,

“Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, ‘Peace be with you.’” These words from today’s Gospel (see John 20:19-31) describes the quintessential Easter experience: an encounter with the Risen Lord who bestows on us his mercy and peace.

We gather this weekend celebrating the funeral of Pope Francis, who made the mercy of God and the cause of peace central aspects of his ministry as Pastor. "*Miserando atque Eligendo*" was his motto. It is a phrase from a homily of Saint Bede describing Jesus' call of Matthew. It speaks of Jesus' enactment of mercy as he chooses and draws Matthew to a new life of service. Pope Francis wished to create something of the same dynamic in each of us, members of God's Church. He hoped that with the knowledge of God's mercy towards us we might be moved to realize bonds of mercy and peace to be shared with those on the peripheries of life. He wished us to be a Church going out, leaving behind self and self concern, and finding new ways to elicit peace from hearts we encounter, awakening a sense of life, respect and Godly love in every relationship that is ours. His drive "outwards" was so movingly evident his last full day: calling on every ounce of the little strength that remained, he gave his blessing *Urbi et Orbi* (to the city and to the world) and rode the circuits of St. Peter's Square greeting the 50 or so thousands gathered there for Easter of his Jubilee Year of Hope. May the hope created by generous, heartfelt mercy remain strong in us and may we be moved to elicit effective bonds of peace each day anew. Such is our Easter celebration; such are the gifts we celebrate remembering our Pastor, Francis.

Jesus shares the wounds of life with his friend, Thomas. Thomas, indeed every believer, is invited to do more than probe a finger here or there. We are invited to enter in, to be taken up and fully to “put on” Christ, knowing in that way the reality and mercy of Him who has risen from the grave. In his mercy, Jesus does not merely offer peace as a thing to be taken into possession. Rather, in his mercy, we are taken into possession by the peace and goodness of God. In this sense Jesus continues: “As the Father has sent me, so I send you.” The Peace of Easter is not so much our grasp of the Risen Lord and his reality in our lives as it is our being grasped by, taken up into, and transformed by, the mission we receive in Jesus. We are to bring his life, his mercy and his forgiveness to our world. We come to know the “reality” of this new life through its thorough exercise.

Be sent as Jesus was sent. Forgive as he forgives. Bestow peace as God gives peace. Give life in his name as he has given us life. These are the Gospel ways of Easter faith. You and I and each and every generation of believers are invited to live the life of Christ. As the Second Reading proclaims: “I... share with you the distress, the kingdom, and the endurance we have in Jesus” (see Revelation 1:9-11a, 12-13, 17-19). As St. Luke testifies: “Many signs and wonders were done among the people” (see Acts 5:12-16). The “mercy” of God we celebrate this Sunday and the "hope" we honor this Jubilee Year are to be recognized in their enactment: learn by doing. May you be powerfully taken up into the mission of mercy, reconciliation and peace given you by the Lord Jesus. May you come to know the surpassing power of the Living One who has called you.

A word of thanks goes out to all those many who worked to ensure that our Easter celebrations this year would be prayerful and blessed. Their generosity and constancy in service is a great gift of life to our Parish. We thank them for that goodness and ask gifts of God’s mercy upon them and their loved ones.

Our First Communion families will be gathering for the First Communion Retreat Day this coming Saturday. Our Confirmation retreats are this Sunday and next. Join in keeping the candidates in prayer as they prepare to encounter the Risen Lord through the gift of his Eucharist and in the outpouring of the Holy Spirit in the weeks ahead.

The CREATION CARE CORNER

The Team partnered with Black Earth Compost, Marblehead's and the Parish's composting service provider, and Sustainable Marblehead, for a **community wide presentation on composting** held on **Earth Day, Tuesday, April 22**. Peter Fallon of the Creation Care Team spoke of the passing of Pope Francis and the importance of his leadership in environmental affairs through his encyclical *Laudato Si*. Ongoing inspiration and commitment will be a fine way to honor his service and sense of mission.

Discussed were composting of all types of food scraps, including fruits, vegetables, meat, bones, shells, and dairy products, along with compostable service ware as a great way to reduce waste, reuse food scraps, and return nutrients to local soils. It helps to reduce the amount of curbside trash and lessens the amount of food scraps put down the disposal and into local water treatment plants.

Black Earth also collects hard to recycle materials such as electronics, textiles and plastics.

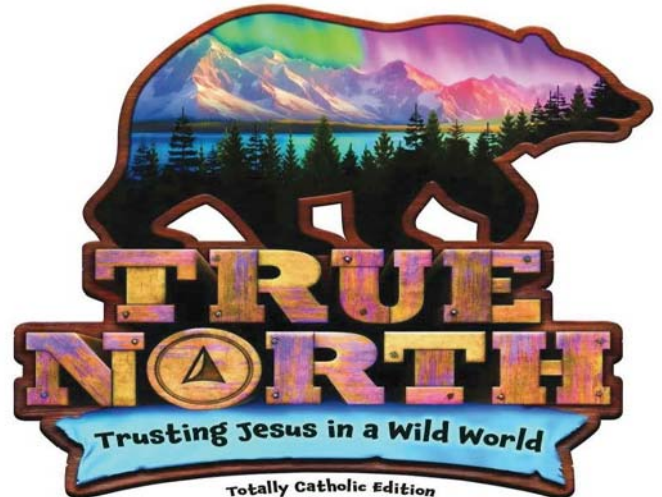


Volunteer(s) for Cookies!

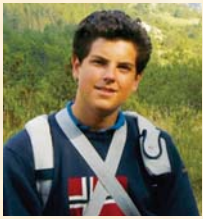

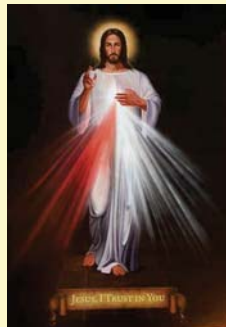

Comments from Deacon Joe

Pope Francis RIP

People occasionally asked me what I thought of Pope Francis. I would answer that I thought he was the pope the Church needed at this time. His formulation that the Church is a "field hospital for sinners" and his reminder that the Eucharist isn't a reward for good behavior were things we needed to hear. He was basically bringing us more fully into the teachings of Vatican II, reminding us that the Church's mission isn't just to ourselves but to bring the gospel to "the peripheries." Although some people thought he was occasionally denying established doctrine, I think that was misunderstanding or misrepresentation. If at times his wording was imprecise, I don't think he ever explicitly denied any dogma. He was devoted to furthering the Church's divine mission in our time.

Our Easter season continues with Divine Mercy Sunday. This day was formerly known by various names. In English it was called Low Sunday, suggesting a contrast with the peak celebration of Easter Sunday. In the custom of designating Sundays by the first words of the introit verse, which began the Mass, it was also called *Quasimodo* Sunday. The introit began "*Quasimodo geniti infantes*" — "Like newborn infants [long for pure spiritual milk]" (1 Peter 2:2). Pope St. John Paul II gave it the title Divine Mercy Sunday. We all should remember that God's mercy is always available to us and everybody else who will accept it.



During Eastertide, the Church replaces the thrice-daily recitation of the Angelus with an Easter-themed prayer called the "*Regina Coeli*" from the first words in the Latin version. It goes as follows:

"Queen of heaven, rejoice, alleluia./ The Son whom you merited to bear, alleluia,/ has risen as he said, alleluia./ Pray for us to God, alleluia.

V. Rejoice and be glad, O Virgin Mary, alleluia.

R. For the Lord has truly risen, alleluia.

Let us pray.

O God, who have been pleased to gladden the world by the Resurrection of your Son our Lord Jesus Christ, grant, we pray, that

through his Mother, the Virgin Mary, we may receive the joys of everlasting life. Through Christ our Lord. Amen."

It comes as a surprise to some Catholics that all Fridays throughout the year, apart from solemnities, are supposed to be days of penance. Although the Bishops of the U.S. relaxed the strict rule of abstinence from meat on Fridays outside Lent, they said, "Friday itself remains a special day of penitential observance throughout the year," and, "Friday should be in each week something of what Lent is in the entire year. For this reason we urge all to prepare for that weekly Easter that comes with each Sunday by freely making of every Friday a day of self-denial and mortification in prayerful remembrance of the passion of Jesus Christ" <https://www.usccb.org/prayer-and-worship/liturgical-year-and-calendar/lent/us-bishops-pastoral-statement-on-penance-and-abstinence>.

This week the Memorial of St. Catherine of Siena is observed on April 29. She was a mystic who lived from 1347 to 1380. She became active as a peacemaker between warring Italian cities. She was canonized in 1461 and declared a Doctor of the Church by Pope St. Paul VI in 1970 and Co-patroness of Europe in 1999 by Pope St. John Paul II https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Catherine_of_Siena.

May 2 brings the Memorial of St. Athanasius, bishop and doctor of the Church. He was born around the year 297 and was elected Patriarch of Alexandria in 328. He vigorously upheld the orthodox doctrine of the divinity of Christ, as declared by the Council of Nicaea. Because of opposition from Arian heretics he was exiled from Alexandria numerous times. He died in 373, and is recognized as one of the four great Doctors of the Eastern Church https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Athanasius_of_Alexandria.

We celebrate the Feast of the Apostles Sts. Philip and James on May 3. Little is known about them apart from what we read in the gospels. They have a common feast day because their relics were brought from Constantinople to Rome at the same time in the Sixth Century <https://www.franciscanmedia.org/saint-of-the-day/saints-philip-and-james/>.
