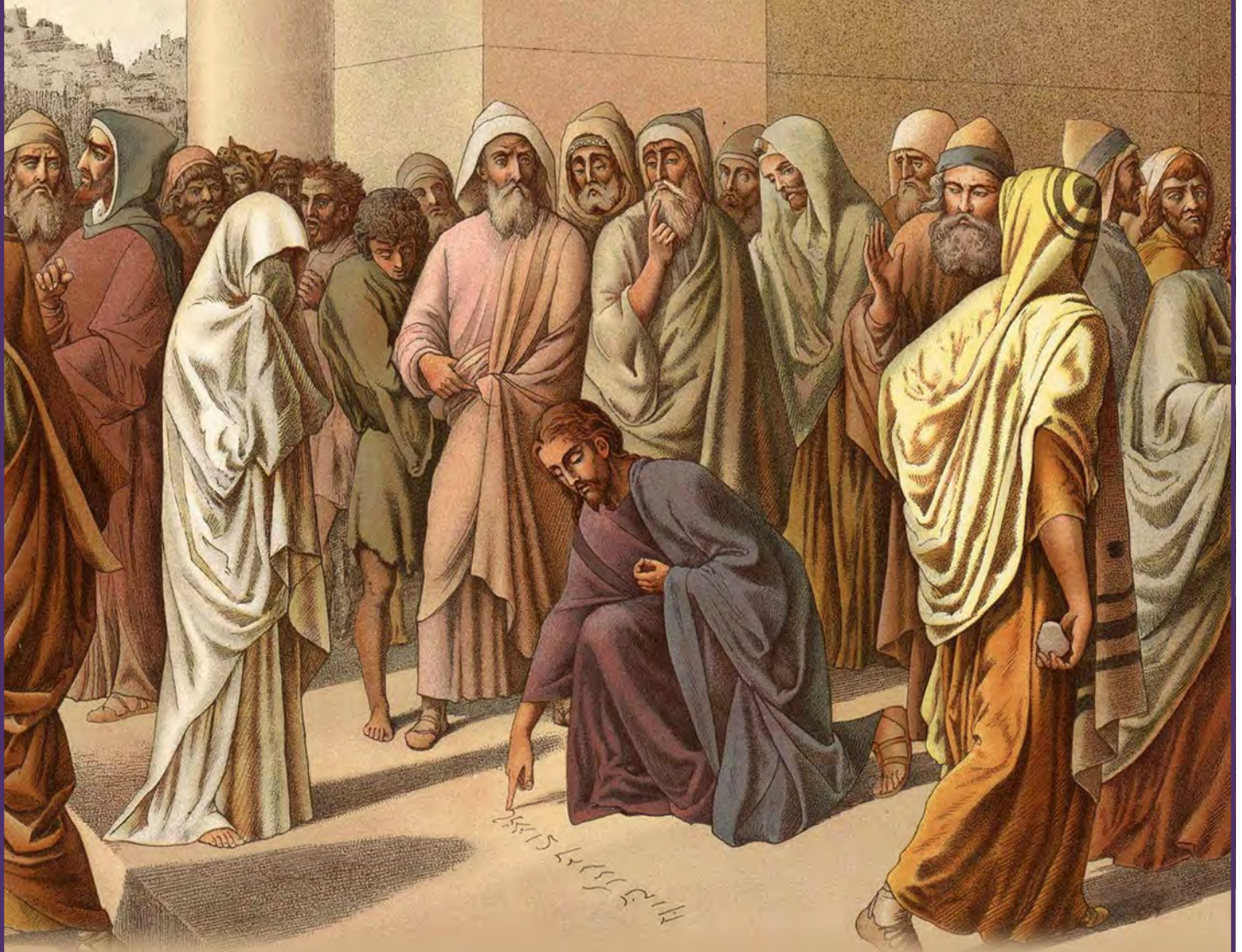

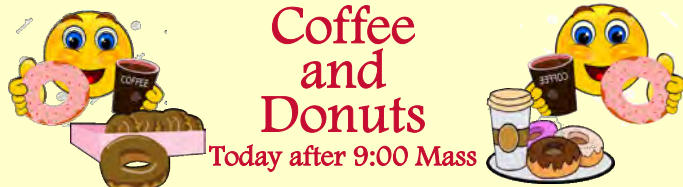

Fifth Sunday of Lent

Dear Parishioner of Our Lady Star of the Sea,

“See, I am doing something new! Now it springs forth, do you not perceive it?” These words from the prophecy of Isaiah (see Is 43:16-21) ring appropriately in our ears this Fifth Sunday of Lent, the First Sunday of Passiontide, in which we will celebrate newness of life given to us through the death and rising of the Lord. Isaiah points us to Christ and the newness of life we receive through the forgiveness of our sins.

What beauty is contained in the words of Christ to the woman caught in adultery (see John 8:1-11): “Neither do I condemn you. Go and from now on do not sin any more.” This is the newness of Lent. God is not the one who condemns. God sent his Son into the world not to condemn the world but that the world might be saved through him (see John 3 ff.). Condemnation comes as the result of our transgressions themselves. In the Gospel story, the woman is placed in jeopardy by her infidelity, by the cowardly flight of her consort and by the rush to judgment of the neighbors. Every evil action contains its own consequence and adds to the burden of our fallen world.

Misery and Mercy meet together in the Gospel story, as they do in each of our lives. Jesus’ spirit of detachment, peace and balance leaves him free to defend the trapped woman from the hatred, scorn and violence of the leaders and crowd. Christ offers the woman, and us, the free gift of God’s forgiveness and the grace of the mission and command to remain free by avoiding sin in the future. Now there is something new! Now there is something to set as a goal in one’s Lenten journey: you can go forth and avoid sin!

Jesus, in his mercy, seeks to take possession of our hearts, as St. Paul reminds us in the Second Reading (see Philippians 3:8-14). Live free and live in Christ eternally! So, too, with Paul we celebrate that newness of life in Christ Jesus: “forgetting what lies behind but straining forward to what lies ahead, I continue my pursuit toward the goal, the prize of God’s upward calling, in Christ Jesus.” This Lent God calls you “upward.” Rise with Jesus, free of sin, alive in God’s love! Jesus calls us to join in a communion of mind and heart with him in the outreach of his Mercy to this fallen world. We do this as we are forgiven by Christ and, thus, enabled to forgive one another in Christ. We do this as we abide by his Word and go forth, resolved to follow his command: “from now on do not sin any more.”

Our Lenten journey as a Parish family continues. Please remember the opportunities for sacramental reconciliation on Thursday nights and Saturday afternoons. The prayer such as Friday Stations of the Cross, our Bible Study, the works of mercy such as My Brother’s Table, the Food Pantry, the Easter Clothing Drive and the St. Vincent de Paul boxes are all ways to focus your Lenten journey and let God do “something new” in your life this year.

The CREATION CARE CORNER

The Team is pleased to partner with Black Earth Compost, Marblehead's and the Parish's composting service provider, and Sustainable Marblehead, for a community wide presentation on composting. It will be held on **Earth Day, Tuesday, April 22**, at 7pm in the Hall at the Parish Center.

Composting all types of food scraps, including fruits, vegetables, meat, bones, shells, and dairy products, along with compostable service ware is a great way to reduce waste, reuse food scraps, and return nutrients to local soils. It helps to reduce the amount of curbside trash and lessens the amount of food scraps put down the disposal and into local water treatment plants.

Black Earth also collects hard to recycle materials such as electronics, textiles and plastics.

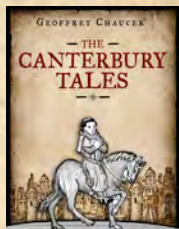
Comments from Deacon Joe

March/April

As we enter the “homestretch” of Lent, we are looking forward to the highest point of our year, the Sacred Triduum, the Holy Three Days which begin on the evening of Holy Thursday and continue through Easter Sunday itself. Most of us are aware of the solemn liturgies of those days, when we recall the Last Supper, the Crucifixion and the Resurrection of Jesus from the tomb. Less widely known is the Paschal Fast, which encourages us to continue the fast and abstinence required on Good Friday — to continue them voluntarily through Holy Saturday. As stated on the website of the US Conference of Catholic Bishops, “If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the “paschal fast” to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily his Resurrection.”

The extension of the fast into Holy Saturday is not an obligation, but it can be a very good way to preserve the quality of the day as something beyond the everyday. Why not consider it and give it a try [Paschal Fast?](#)



March went “out like a lamb.” Let’s see if “April showers bring May flowers.” We had a fair amount of rain in March, hardly the “droghte” of which Chaucer speaks in the first lines of the Canterbury Tales: “Whan that Aprile

with his shoures soote,/ The droghte of March hath perced to the roote, ...” In Chaucer’s day April was apparently the start of pilgrimage season. Perhaps some of us will be able to go on pilgrimage to Rome for the Jubilee, or to one of the designated pilgrimage churches here in the Archdiocese of Boston. Maybe some will make a pilgrimage to Santiago de Compostela or to the Holy Land. If you’re traveling to England, I recommend making a pilgrimage to Canterbury as part of your trip. I was there in 1987, and seeing the faint blood stains still visible at the spot where St. Thomas Becket was martyred was a



very powerful experience <https://www.canterbury-archaeology.org.uk/becket-altar-memorial>. In our own country and in Canada and Mexico there are also numerous shrines which can be destinations for pilgrimages which can be the purpose of travel or at least part of the plan. If you can’t go in person, the internet offers opportunities for visiting holy places virtually. Choose your “destination” and make your online visit.
