Dear Parishioner of Our Lady Star of the Sea,

Foundations. Our prayer together this weekend is about how to build on grace. "Upon this rock I will build my Church." These words of promise and fulfillment pronounced in such solemn fashion by our Lord (see Matthew 16:13-20) form a foundation for our prayer together this weekend.

The Lord makes it clear to Peter and to all his followers that it is in the profession of Jesus as "the Christ, the Son of the living God," that we discover both who Jesus really is and, consequent to that, who we really are as well. Just as Simon, Son of Jonah, received a new name, Peter, and a new mission, so too you and I find our true identity as those called to new life in Christ and charged with bringing the proclamation of the Gospel to the whole world. This is not something that comes to us through "flesh and blood." It is the work of God's own love, God's own grace within us. You and I are built up in that love and in that grace. We are brought together as a "Church," a communion of life and love together with Jesus and with each other. God builds us together into a new unity. Not a political or social assembly, but as the living, speaking, acting body of Christ present in the world today. In that unity, in that communion of mind and heart that the world cannot give, but that is God's own gift to us, the Church that we are is both a promise and, already, a fulfillment of God's saving plan of love for our human family.

Foundations. Be a living Word of Promise and Fulfillment! Be a teacher of the Gospel! As our Summer breaks come to a conclusion with Labor Day next weekend and the reopening of the school year soon upon us, we receive from Jesus the charge to be a word of promise and fulfillment for the renewal of this world. In learning who Jesus really is, we come to know the truth of our own lives and destiny. We truly come to life in him. We are still in need of teachers for our Religious Education program this year. My prayer is that you might be ready and generous in taking a greater share in the Lord's work of building up his Church, of bringing new life and hope to others by teaching his ways. The dangers of the world around us are great in these days. All the more important does it become to give our younger generation firm foundations, a firm rock, on which to build a life. The spiritual health of our new generation is the basis for all other blessings. We need your help to help! No one is too young, no one too old, no one too unsure, no one too busy, no one too afraid, to be a help to the Lord, and to us, in this important work.

Comments from Deacon Joe

Saint Augustine

This week we celebrate two obligatory memorials. First, on August 28, comes the Memorial of St. Augustine, one of the four greatest Doctors of the Church in the West (the others being saints Jerome, Ambrose, and Gregory the Great). Augustine was born in 354 in northern Africa and died on August 28, 430, in Hippo in what is now



Algeria. His family were probably Berbers: his mother, Monica, a Christian, and his father, Patricius, a pagan. He was well educated, eventually moving to Italy to teach. Meanwhile he had entered a relationship with a woman which produced a son, and he became a follower of the heresy Manichæism. In 387, however, Augustine converted to Christianity and was baptized in Milan by St. Ambrose.

Augustine then returned to Africa, where he eventually became bishop of Hippo. He was an eloquent preacher and wrote extensively, including his Confessions, The City of God, On the Trinity, and many others. The Confessions is a spiritual autobiography in which he addresses God with the story of his life, including his early sinfulness and his eventual conversion. The City of God explains that the Roman Empire, which was then experiencing barbarian invasions — or any other earthly nation — is not God's kingdom on earth. Rather the City of God (those faithful to God, roughly speaking the Church) is God working in the world alongside earthly kingdoms,

which can come and go. On the Trinity and many other works develop Christian theology deeply and extensively. For centuries he was the principal theologian and philosopher of the Western Church, and his work continues to teach us today. The Confessions is worth reading still https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Augustine_of_Hippo.

The Memorial of the <u>Passion of St. John the Baptist</u> is on August 29. The story of the beheading of St. John is familiar. (Mark 6:17-29 and parallels in the other gospels.) John had told Herod that he was wrong to have married his sister-in-law, which led to his imprisonment and eventually to his death. Like him and like Jesus, we should be prepared to speak the truth to those who do not understand. As St. Peter says in

his epistle, we are to do so with gentleness and respect, and we should recognize when it is time to speak, and when it is time to be silent. Above all, our lives of love for God and neighbor should witness to the truth



of the gospel https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/John the Baptist.
