

December 24, 2023 Fourth Sunday of Advent

Dear Parishioner of Our Lady Star of the Sea,

It is truly "good news of great joy" that gathers our Parish family in celebration of Christmas each year. This year, our Fourth Sunday of Advent and Christmas Eve back right up against one another. This Sunday, we see the altar and church prepared all but to celebrate the great Solemnity of our Salvation, the Birth of Jesus Christ, our Lord. We should, likewise, approach Christmas prepared, prepared to celebrate the full realization of God's gifts of life and love to us and to our world. We welcome in a special way those home for the holidays. We pray with deepened fervor for those who are sick, those away from family and friends and, especially, those in service to our country.

Our almost-upon-us celebration of Christmas finds an exquisite focus this weekend in a conversation of Mary with the Angel Gabriel and the assent of Mary to the Word made manifest to her (see Luke 1:26-38). "Hail, full of grace! The Lord is with you!" says Gabriel. "May it be done to me according to your word!" replies our Blessed Mother. She heard the greeting of Gabriel. She received from her conversation the true meaning of the 'favor' she had found with God. She was to bring forth the Son of the Most High. She was to be overshadowed by the power of the Holy Spirit and thereby give birth to the Son of God. All that seems impossible to the world is, in fact and in her, possible for God. She brings forth for the world its Savior and, from the humility of her heart and circumstance, introduces the world to the one power of love that can save and give life, eternally.

In her special role Mary illumines and foreshadows the mission that is ours in the Gospel. You and I have been greeted by the messenger of God in and through the words of the Gospel witness. We are to speak to one another how the "Lord is with you" in the life, ministry, death and rising of Jesus. By entering a living conversation with the Gospel, you and I come to understand the meaning of the favor we receive from the Most High. We are to live a new life in holiness and in peace. We are to freely love God with all that is in us and our neighbor as our self. We, the ministers of this Good News, have God's Holy Spirit come upon us, first at Pentecost and, now, through the sacrament of Confirmation. You and I have been overshadowed by the power of the Most High. By that power, we bring into effect the saving plan of God.

Announce the Good News! We trust that Jesus is with us as we bring the reality of his life and love to all the earth, even to the end of time. Mostly, it is by the humility of our hearts and, by our deliberate choice, the humility of our circumstance, that we introduce the world to the one, the only one, who can save and give life eternally. Our Christmas presents are but a small reminder of the one present, the one gift that has made the impossible real: the love of God made flesh in Christ Jesus.

A *Christmas Present* for those in need: Our deep thanks go to all who have participated in the Christmas Tree Gift program this year. The response was wonderful and the follow-through absolutely fantastic so that we were able to sort, prepare and deliver so much joy to so many in the Lord's love. May your kindness to others truly warm and enliven your celebration of Christmas this year. May the Christmas Tree's light and beauty remind us how much thoughtfulness and kindness reflect the saving love of God for his world.

Comments from Deacon Joe

Advent: Fourth "Week"

<u>The fourth week of Advent</u> is only one day long because Christmas Day is tomorrow. I hope we're all ready for the feast.

This week we have one solemnity and three feasts. As you know, December 25 is the Solemnity of the Nativity of Our Lord and Savior Jesus

Christ. The birth of Jesus was, of course, a necessary step along the way to his saving work. His visible presence in our world is certainly something to celebrate, and the Church does so throughout Christmastide, which extends to the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, which will be on January 8, the day after Epiphany. December 25 was chosen for the date of the celebration in the Fourth Century, for reasons which are not definitely known, but it is appropriate. John the Baptist said of Jesus, "He must increase and I must decrease." The lengthening of daylight hours from now until summer is a good image of this. <u>https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Christmas</u>.

Next is the Feast of St. Stephen, on December 26, the day

on which "Good King Wenceslas looked out," according to the carol. The King's charity reflects the original task of Stephen and the other deacons: assuring a fair distribution of goods; and his charity is reflected in the English custom of Boxing Day on which gifts were given to servants



and workers. Stephen became an effective preacher of the Resurrection of Christ and was martyred for his efforts, the first Christian martyr. See Acts of the Apostles, chapters 6-7. Since Stephen was the first deacon, his day is special for me and other deacons <u>https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Saint_Stephen</u>.

December 27 brings the Feast of **St. John the Evangelist**, believed to be the one referred to in the Gospel of John as "the disciple whom Jesus loved." He is prominent at vari-

ous points in all four gospels, and he alone among the apostles did not die a martyr's death. It is generally believed that he is the author of the three epistles of John as well as the gospel which bears his name. For various reasons, most scholars believe that the author of the Book of Revelation was a different John. John's



gospel is a powerful witness to the belief of the Church that Jesus is divine <u>https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/</u>John the Evangelist.

Then on December 28 we celebrate the Feast of the Holy



Innocents, baby boys of Bethlehem who were killed by order of King Herod in an attempt to eliminate "the newborn King of the Jews" whom the Magi had spoken of. Matthew 2:1-18, especially verse 16. Although they did not know of Christ, they died because of Herod's opposition to Christ and thus can be considered martyrs <u>https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/</u><u>Massacre_of_the_Innocents</u>.

Taken together, the three feasts tell us that we must have faith in Jesus, who was born in Bethlehem and died and rose to save us. But Jesus and his message continue to find opposition, which can lead to persecution. We have to stand firm in our faith as we rejoice in the birth of the Lord.
