

February 11, 2024 Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Parishioner of Our Lady Star of the Sea,

"A leper came to Jesus" (see Mark 1:40-45). If we were reading the Gospel According to St. Mark all of a piece, this scene would jump out at us as something new. The crowds of enthusiastic people that have been part of every scene up until now, now are gone. The focus is one-on-one. Jesus is face to face with this man in desperate need. Jesus was, as the reading says, "moved with pity" and that he "stretched out his hand" and "touched him."

Lepers were forced to dwell apart, away, out of sight, out of mind, out of heart. Jesus, however, welcomes this leper's presence. This one-on-one encounter is presented by St. Mark to help us focus on the main aim of Jesus' ministry: to address and put an end to the disfiguring ravages of sin. Sin fearfully disrupts the whole human person: body, mind, spirit as well as the full play of social interaction and intimate communion with God and with neighbor. St. Mark is pointing to Jesus' confrontation with the root of sin and death that he will face in his passion. On the cross, Jesus will make us clean. He, the priest, will bring humanity together at his feet at our worse, ugliest death-dealing ways. He fulfills on his cross the great commandment of perfect love of the Father and, at the same time, directly, lovingly embraces every mortal human being by touching the fearsome depth of the physical, social and spiritual crossroads of death. There is a feared physical, spiritual and social dimension of every serious sin: being hurt and being the cause of loneliness, being abandoned by others and abandoning our just responsibilities, and seemingly, being left behind by life itself, and leaving the joys of life behind ourselves. Jesus wants us, his followers, to make things clean by meeting every encounter with sin in ourselves or other with a deeper love and solidarity, not less.

Today is World Marriage Sunday. We will have a special blessing at the end of Mass for our for our marriages and for our homes, together with a commemorative gift.

Today is also the World Day of Prayer for the Sick. It is a day to think of better, more loving responses to the needs of sick relatives and friends. May we in Christ renew compassion and stretch out our concern and reach out in a determinative love and presence for the sake of others, especially, with a warm and warmth giving heart for those who are ill and for those who serve the sick day in and day out, often for long periods of time.

Saint Va Lentine's Day

This Wednesday is both St. Valentine's Day and Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent. It is a good occasion for us to consider the purpose both of our relationships and of our Lenten renewal in Christ. Make your prayer, almsgiving and fasting ways of increasing the warmth of your heart, as together we stretch forward toward the celebration of Easter fire, hearts ardent in faith hope and love.

With that in mind, please remember that Wednesday <u>is</u> a day of fast and abstinence for Catholics. The challenge is, then, set to find more creative ways to say "I love you" than the usual box of candy or ro-mantic dinner out. You can do it!

Ash Wednesday Masses will be at Our Lady Star of the Sea Church at 9:00 a.m. and at 7:00 p.m. Brief Liturgies of the Word will be held at noon in the Church and at 3:00 p.m. at the Center.

### Ash Wednesday


<u>Normally February 14</u> is the Memorial of Saints Cyril and Methodius, two brothers who served as missionaries to the Slavic peoples along the Danube in the 9th Century <u>https://www.britannica.com/biography/Saints-</u>

Cyril-and-Methodius. It is also St. Valentine's Day (not

on the Roman liturgical calendar, having been superseded by Cyril and Methodius). But this year it happens to be Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent. (So if you're



planning to give chocolates to somebody, it might make sense to do it on Tuesday).



The point of Lent, as Cardinal Roche puts it, is to answer the Father's call to return to him. "With great tenderness the Father's voice in Lent calls us home, where each of us belongs, no one is excluded—the saint and the sinner, the great and the small, the wavering and the secure. None of us is worthy, but that is where we belong." (See the article in

#### St. Vincent de Paul — Collection Boxes


Please remember that there are boxes at the doors of the Church for charitable donations for the benefit of persons in need who seek help from the Church.
