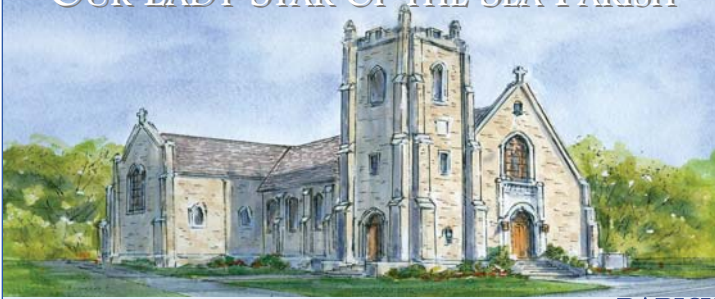

Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Parishioner of Our Lady Star of the Sea,

“Blessed are you... rejoice and leap for joy.” Today’s Gospel (see Luke 6:17, 20-26) presents us with St. Luke’s portrayal of the “Beatitudes.” While the more familiar version of St. Matthew (see Mt 5:1-12) is in the third person (Blessed are the poor in spirit), St. Luke’s rendition puts it more directly by using the second person: “Blessed are you!”

That directness of approach helps us understand, too, the meaning of the word “blessed.” The original Greek, *macarios*, means more than “happy.” It refers to an overabundant goodness of body, mind and spirit coming as a gift from God. Jesus is rejoicing in the gifts God has bestowed on those gathered in his presence, and invites them to share in his love as well.

We have just celebrated St. Valentine’s Day. It may be well for us to think of the quality of our loves in life by the measure of the beatitudes. Most especially, we should consider the example of Christ who in this direct encounter with disciples, both Jews and Greeks alike, is caught up in love *for them*. Moved by this love, Jesus is able to witness to the abundant goodness with which God has blessed his loved ones. Jesus invites his disciples to come alive in that love, indeed, to “rejoice and leap for joy.” The loves of our life can be perceived for who they really are, but not by focus on our own self, our need, our fulfillment. No. Rather, we really encounter “love” in life when we rejoice and leap for joy over the *other*, our loved ones, their goodness, their benefit. Our love should bring our loved ones ever closer to God. May that be real in your life and may that reality bring you and your loved ones the true “Blessedness” God so ardently desires for you.

The presentation of the Beatitudes in St. Luke is also notable for the way that the “Woes” are integrated into the presentation. In the crowds around Jesus there are many, busy with themselves and their success, hurrying on the road, scarcely paying attention to others, let alone to his presence or to his word. They too are in his love, but he expresses his deep concern for the danger of their loss: “Woe are you....”

We are about to celebrate Presidents' Day and, here in town, Washington's Birthday. We might use the occasion to think about measures of blessedness and of woe in our country these days and the turmoil among us and around us in the world. There is much afoot. There are many opportunities and pitfalls before us. We should, in such a time, seek to think with the Lord. We should try to see through the slogans and recriminations tossed about and think of those things that build for true blessedness before God and neighbor. Pursue these. We can see, too, the woes of self-service and failures both personal and systemic that exist. Avoid these, but in a way that is yet built on genuine love and respect for the persons with whom we may disagree.

Asking God’s blessing on you and your loved ones and on our nation, I am

The CREATION CARE CORNER BLACK PLASTICS



Black plastics, largely as single-use packing and trays for food, occasion questions concerning toxic and flame retardant chemicals therein that may leach into food during cooking. Often, recycling centers cannot accept these items because of sorting issues, so they end in landfills, with possible damage.

Consider these suggestions:

- * Replace any black utensils, like spatulas and soup spoons, with those made of wood or stainless steel.
- * Avoid microwaving black plastic containers or trays.
- * Switch any food you purchase in black plastic to glass, ceramic or metal storage containers.
- * When ordering takeout food or drink, request non plastic packaging, leaving black plastic utensils, stirrers or straws behind. Use instead your own non plastic utensils and cutlery from home.
- * Purchase a cup of coffee-to-go using your own ceramic or metal coffee mug rather than single use hot cups especially those with black plastic sippy lids.

What to do with remaining items?

MacRae's Sustainable Goods in Marblehead, in collaboration with Plastic Recycled, may be able to recycle/repurpose black plastic into cool products such as benches and chairs.

Comments from Deacon Joe

Migrants



On February 10, Pope Francis sent a letter to the bishops of the United States. In it he reiterated long-standing Church teaching about migrants. He quoted Pope Pius XII on the Holy Family's flight into Egypt as an example of emigrants and refugees. He went on to recall that refugees and migrants have equal human dignity to the native

population of the country where they are and calls on all people of good will to consider whether government policies respect that dignity. "An authentic rule of law is verified precisely in the dignified treatment all people deserve, especially the poorest and most marginalized." He also says, "I exhort all the faithful of the Catholic Church, and all men and women of good will, not to give in to narratives that discriminate against and cause unnecessary suffering to our migrant and refugee brothers and sisters. With charity and clarity we are all called to live in solidarity and fraternity, to build bridges that bring us ever closer together, to avoid walls of ignominy and to learn to give our lives as Jesus Christ gave his for the salvation of all." Meanwhile news reports tell us that the federal government has stopped supporting the work of Catholic Charities to support refugees legally in the United States and is even not paying for work they did under contract in November and December. Similarly, shutting down USAID devastates the work of Catholic Relief Services to relieve poverty and suffering around the world. There are those who say all such efforts to help the poor are not the responsibility of government but are the responsibility of the "private sector." Whether or not we agree with this as a matter of political philosophy, our Catholic faith tells us to care for those in need, which we do as individuals and as a Church, including the work of Catholic Charities (<https://www.ccab.org>) and Catholic Relief Services ([https://support.crs.org/donate/help-around-world-2?](https://support.crs.org/donate/help-around-world-2?ms=agigoo0924bge00gen01&gad_source=1&gbraid=0AAAAAD_ivJaGpvrqID_Co_G5BC4TTO32x3&gclid=CjwKCAiA5Ka9BhB5EiwA1ZVtvB2DspjH2tQwabe_cjuFK-yNeVTbM9ftkuza2IEDCih7ZG_u8pnrXgRoCowwQAvD_BwE)

they still need money to continue their good work, and I think we all should consider what we can do to support that work and increase our giving or begin to contribute generously as our means permit.

Catholic **UPDATE**

This month's issue is titled "Devotion to the Sacred Heart: Finding Hope in a Troubled World." Pope Francis recently

issued an encyclical titled "*Dilexit Nos* (He Loved Us)" on the Sacred Heart of Jesus. In it he calls us to reflect God's love for us in our love for others and our concern for their needs. The Update proposes a novena meditating on qualities of the Heart of Jesus and praying that our hearts be conformed to his. We are in the Jubilee Year of Hope, and the subtitle of the Update ties into that by reminding us that the love of God, shown in the Sacred Heart of Jesus, is the foundation of all our hope for ourselves and for the whole world.

This week we celebrate the Feast of the Chair of St. Peter on February 22. In St. Peter's Basilica in Rome there is a wooden chair encased in bronze which is venerated as the chair of St. Peter. Archaeological study suggests that it does not date back to the time of St. Peter, but it still serves, in the words of Pope Benedict XVI, as "a symbol of the special mission of Peter and his Successors to tend Christ's flock, keeping it united in faith and in charity." Prelates traditionally sit to preach and teach, so this feast is one on which we honor and thank God for the office of St. Peter and his successors, the Popes, as guarantor of the unity of the Church
