# OUR LADY STAR OF THE SEA PARISH

Marblehead, Massachusetts

February 25, 2024 Second Sunday of Lent

Dear Parishioner of Our Lady Star of the Sea,

"Do not lay your hand on the boy,' said the messenger. 'Do not do the least thing to him." These words of command from God to Abraham cannot but resound in our ears with particular force as we contemplate the horrors of violence in our world today and in our society as well. The conflicts that continue in Ukraine, the Holy Land, Africa and so many other places around the world bring death to the innocent, young and old, and from all sides of conflict. Our own society has been wounded by violence of many sorts and by threats of violence as well. Far too much harm has been visited, one upon another, and continues to be.

God had asked Abraham to make a gift of his son, Isaac, to him. Abraham, mistakenly, thinks it is by way of human sacrifice that the gift was to be accomplished. God's messenger intervened and made it clear: God wants no harm to come to Isaac. What God wants is Abraham's, and our, unreserved devotion to him. God rejoices in that gift and promises Abraham: "in your descendants all the nations of the earth shall find blessing— all this because you obeyed my command." How urgent it has become for us, too, as messengers of God in our devotion to him and in our observance of his commands, to intervene in our own day and to make clear that God wills no harm be done.

The words from the Transfiguration of Christ presented in today's Gospel (see Mark 9:2-10) speak of the Father's love for his Son, Jesus, and the inestimable value of listening to Jesus' Word and following in his way. "From the cloud came a voice, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him." God, who holds his Son in such dear love, seeks to hold you and me in the same love, having made us one with his Son by having us listen to him.

While many peoples will have various answers and remedies to the scourge of violence in our midst, each of those many suggestions can and should be evaluated according to the merits of their reasonableness and likely effectiveness. However, the root of the problem is in the human heart, faithlessly enslaved to sin. There, only the words of Jesus have the power to transform, illumine and raise up. Your own commitment to Gospel living and to bringing the light of the Gospel to effect in the common life we share as citizens of our nation is the only way in which the blessings of safety and peace for generations of descendants can ultimately be secured. So listen! So speak!

None of us can remain indifferent. You should take every opportunity at your disposal to point to everything that the light of reason and the love of the faith tells about life, the good ways of moving forward, the truth and the dignity of every human being! This means, with special insistence, that you demand every politician in service to you to eschew social violence. That violence includes also, by shear volume, the abortion regime in our nation and the vast sacrifice of children on the false altar of progress that abortion has brought about. Our own country needs to "listen" more attentively to a voice greater than its own. God calls you, like Christ, to assume readily the burdens of others, unable to guarantee for themselves life, respect or dignity. Bear with them that burden in a deeper love such as to transfigure the world from its fallen horrors to the glory to which God calls us all. Listen to Christ's Word; follow in his ways generously; work for the true good and liberation of your brothers and sisters. God will bring you to share his glory through your devotion to Christ and your honoring of his command. Do no harm.

Before the Cross of Christ displayed in the Sanctuary, there are the name of our Confirmation Candidates who have begun their proximate preparation for the celebration of that sacrament this coming Fall. You are invited to take a name from the basket and to make that person a remembrance in your prayer before God from now until their Confirmation.

Asking God's blessing on you, your loved ones and your home and our world, I am





The Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence from meat for those 14 years or older. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting in which one modest meal may be taken together with two other takings of solid food that do not add up to a meal, for ages 18 through 59.

#### Comments from Deacon Joe



There are different ways we can give alms. Perhaps the MSGIVING most confined to a charitable or-

ganization. An excellent form of almsgiving is working at an organization that provides for poor people such as volunteering at My Brother's Table or Lifebridge. Donating goods, for example BROTHER'S to Catholic Charities, is also almsgiving. We can also give alms directly to an individual, whether it is a needy neighbor or a stranger. Any of these can "count" as our Lenten almsgiving. Of course, they shouldn't be restricted just to Lent, but in Lent we should do more in one way or another, depending on our situation.

> I often give money to "panhandlers" when I encounter them. I know there are those who say the person may spend it poorly, and that's a respectable opinion, but my feeling is that if

and it's not my job to control them. But I'm not always as generous as I like to think I am. Once I was going to a nice, and expensive, restaurant in Lynn. As I parked my car a young man approached and asked for some money. I reached into my pocket and found a ten dollar bill. It occurred to me that I could give him a twenty and never miss it, but I said, "Nah," and gave him the ten. Another time in the subway, a man was sitting with a sign saying he was homeless. I gave him \$2.00 when I could easily have given five. Both times, as I left, I asked myself why I was so stingy. It wasn't even a

question of "giving until it hurts." I

someone asks for money, my job is to be generous,

never would have missed the larger amount in either instance, and I believe the impulses to give more were "actual graces" from the Holy Spirit.

The point of my story is that I, and we, should try to be alert to the opportunities God gives us to provide for the needy and not to stifle the impulse to be generous, whether it's one-to-one, volunteering, or donating to an organization.




