July 2, 2023 Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Parishioner of Our Lady Star of the Sea,

Our Gospel passage from Matthew that we pray this weekend comes from the teaching of Jesus to his disciples as he sends them out on mission. The passage is often referred to as the "Mission Discourse" by biblical commentators. It is a good one for us to pray this weekend as we consider our mission as Catholic believers in the context of our country this coming Fourth of July Holiday and the mission of our country in the context of the wider world.

Jesus says: "Whoever finds his life will lose it and whoever loses his life for my sake will find it (see Mt 10:37-42). The saying holds both a warning and a promise. The warning concerns those who are out to serve themselves and their own interests. That sense of finding merely one's own way in life leads to a loosing of perspective, direction and one's ultimate destiny in God. Rather, those who truly find their place in life in and through the words and example of Jesus' Gospel are ready to "lose" their life by making a gift of themselves in love for the sake of the other and, so, come to find their way to happiness and the fullness of life in heaven. Such is the way of the cross to which we are called as disciples of the Lord on mission.

Saint, John Paul II, in a visit to the United States some thirty-three years ago, addressed our nation in these words:

your deepest identity and truest character as a nation is revealed in the position you take towards the human person. *The ultimate test of your greatness is in the way you treat every human being, but especially the weakest and most defenseless ones...*

- feeding the poor and welcoming refugees;
- reinforcing the social fabric of this nation;
- promoting the true advancement of women;
- securing the rights of minorities;
- pursuing disarmament, while guaranteeing legitimate defense;

all this will succeed only if respect for life and its protection by the law is granted to every human being *from conception until natural death*.

Every human person – no matter how vulnerable or helpless, no matter how young or how old, no matter how healthy, handicapped or sick, no matter how useful or productive for society – is a being of inestimable worth created in the image and likeness of God.

You and I bear the mission of the Gospel. That Gospel says "Whoever gives only a cup of cold water to one of these little ones to drink... will surely not lose his reward." We are first to live genuinely, and then call others to a way of life that reaches out in love to those most in need because of and to the measure of God's own love. Such is a wonderful way of life. Such is the greatness of our calling to liberty in Christ. Such is the way which you and I should help to make happiness real in our nation and in our world.

Asking God's blessing on our country this Independence Day holiday, on our families and on our Parish family, I am



Comments from Deacon Joe

The Glorious Fourth "All men are created equal" This phrase from the Declaration of Independence is very important, as is the following line: "they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights." Our country is based on these principles. There is a creator, who gives everyone rights which are theirs simply as humans, rights which no person, no government can take away but which all must respect. In the Church we speak of God's universal, unconditional love, freedom of conscience, and our duty to love our neighbor as ourselves. The Declaration of Independence, in its wording, is consistent with our belief about the relationship of every person to God and to all other people. Although the Founders didn't apply these principles consistently, especially with regard to slavery, as a nation we have certainly made progress. We can celebrate the Fourth of July because our founding set us in a good direction. We should rededicate ourselves to recognize the equality of all people before God and in society.

Summer Vacation I attended Star of the Sea School from 1949 through 1956. At the end of every school year, as summer vacation was about to begin, the Sisters would remind us, "There is no vacation from God." We should not stop going to Sunday Mass just because we're on vacation. Of course, if circumstances make us unable to attend Mass — for example, if we're on a cruise ship in the middle of the Atlantic Ocean - we are excused, just as we would be at any other time of the year. But there are sites such as masstimes.org (As an experiment, I



typed in Cardiff, Wales, and it gave me a listing of seven Masses in Cardiff, and four across the river in Bristol, England, along with a map showing the location of the churches.) https://masstimes.org So wherever you may travel, you can see if there's a Mass within striking distance.

This week we celebrate the Feast of St. Thomas the Apostle on July 3. He brought the gospel to India, establishing the St. Thomas Christians in Kerala on the southwestern coast of the country. He had refused to believe the other apostles when they said Jesus had appeared to them after his resurrection, but when the Lord appeared to him, he expressed his faith in the exclamation, "My Lord and my God," which we can pray silently at the elevation of the host and the chalice during Mass. This is why those words



are inscribed in Latin (Dominus meus et Deus meus) on the top step of our altar. His faith reinforces our faith. His missionary zeal should inspire us. https:// en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Thomas_the_Apostle
