OUR LADY STAR OF THE SEA PARISH

July 23, 2023 Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Parishioner of Our Lady Star of the Sea,

During these Summer weeks, the Church presents us with a number of the parables from Matthew's version of the Gospel. We are currently praying from the teachings about the Kingdom of Heaven (see Matthew 13:24-42). Many of the Kingdom parables are in enjoyable, outdoor summer settings. The parables, as simple, quickly understood comparisons, make it easier for us to think about, to picture and to commit to the reality of God's presence in our lives and our right relationship with God and one another in God.

"The kingdom of heaven may be likened to a man who sowed good seed in his field. While everyone was asleep his enemy came and sowed weeds all through the wheat, and then went off..." The point of the image is different from what we heard last week. Then it was a matter of good seed being sown into the midst of pre-existing thorns. The result was a choked-off existence. Here, it is a matter of good seed, well sown into receptive soil. Another agent is active: the evil one. The weeds of darnel grow strongly in the midst of the good wheat. Seeing and dealing with that reality and disappointment, challenges our right relationship with God and with one another.

First, as regards our relationship with God, the workers accuse the Master of poorly managing the field. We, too, when confronted by unexpected and underserved difficulty and challenge are tempted to express anger with God for having mismanaged the affairs of the world. Secondly, as regards our relationship with one another, the workers insist of going out and ripping away the darnel, demanding that everything and everyone be set right, right away. We too can often insist on immediate and harsh correction of the things of life and relationship, even though such drastic actions often destroy as much of the good as they solve of the problem.

The Master, God, counsels patience: let them both grow together. We are to trust that each reality will show itself to be what it is with time. You and I are to lean on God to know how and when to recognize the evil for what it is and how, then, to deal with the same, without losing anything of the good that God has, and continues to give to us. While growing, wheat and darnel are difficult to distinguish. With time, the good wheat, because it is fruitful, will brown as it grows ripe, sending all of its strength and goodness into the grains to be harvested. The darnel maintains its sharp green and edges because it keeps all of its strength for itself and is otherwise sterile, producing no grain, only an appearance of life. In the end, the browning, wheat bends low under the weight of its rich grain, showing itself ready for harvest. The darnel remains straight, tall, green and unbent, but empty in its pride and hopeless in its lack of produce. At that moment it can be picked off and cleared away easily, making way for the rich harvest, worked by God's Word, that brings to the garner all of the good we have known, given, shared and matured in our relationships with God and one another.

We are to give of ourselves to God and one another generously as does God to us. It is a bit of heaven, given each day, no matter what the apparent difficulties.





Comments from Deacon Joe

My Retreat

I was away at St. Anselm Abbey from the afternoon of July 7 until the afternoon of July 12. It was a good five days. I had brought along two spiritual books, I Heard God Laughing, by Matthew Kelly, and Jesus and the Jewish Roots of the Eucharist, by Brant Pitre. The Kelly book is quite good in the early sections, where he describes how he began to begin praying regularly. It's not quite so impressive toward the end, but overall it's a good explanation of how to pray as personal conversation with God, not just "saying prayers."



The Pitre book, which is available in the church, gives fascinating insights into what the Eucharist means. Reading those books gave me plenty to reflect on.

On Sunday the principal celebrant and homilist of the Mass was Father Aloysius, who was ordained last year. I found his homily so moving that, with his permission, I quoted most of it on July 16 at the 7:30 and 11:00 Masses.

While I was there, I also had a tour of the ongoing work on the building which will house the Gregory J. Grappone '04 Humanities Institute https://www.anselm.edu/about/offices-centers-institutes/centers-institutes/gregory-j-grappone-humanities-institute. I was very excited a couple of years ago to read about the Institute in the college's alumni magazine, and if you agree that the humanities and liberal arts should be the backbone of higher education, I suggest you check out the website. Maybe you'd like to join some of their programs remotely or even support the Institute in some way. At any rate I'm thrilled to see the liberal arts flourishing at St. A's and I'm looking forward to attending the dedication of the new facility on July 28.

Meanwhile back here in Marblehead, Race Week will be this week. The numbers of people coming from out of town and the variety of sailboats involved is nothing like what we used to get in the 1950's but it is still special for those who participate. Maybe you can find a good spot on the Neck to watch. Early in the week, Junior Race Week will have a lot of kids racing just off the lighthouse. Thursday through Sunday the grown ups will mostly be farther offshore, but still visible. If you look closely at the Corinthian Committee Boat on Saturday, I'll be the guy wearing the sailor's cap.


This week the big feast is the Apostle St. James the Greater, celebrated on July 25. He was the brother of St. John — both sons of Zebedee and fishermen before their call to be apostles. He was martyred in Jerusalem. The Cathedral of Santiago de Compostela is a famous pilgrimage destination because of the belief that his relics are there https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/James the Great.

On July 26 we have the Memorial of <u>Saints Joachim and Anne</u>, parents of the Blessed Virgin Mary. The Memorial of Sts. Martha, Mary, and Lazarus is July 29. This day used to be just the memorial of St. Martha, but in 2021 Pope Francis added her siblings Mary and Lazarus.
