

July 9, 2023 Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Parishioner of Our Lady Star of the Sea,

"He shall proclaim peace to the nations" (see Zechariah 9:9-10). The prophet foretold the coming of Christ in whom we are invited to "rejoice heartily." We hear these words as we look back on this week's celebration of Independence Day. We renew our prayer for the peace and security of our country and, indeed, of the world. And we know, as we look at our world's situation, how fragile that security and peace can be. The strife in Ukraine and elsewhere around the world, the aftermath of our recent health crisis and the struggle to understand its origins and implications, the political divisions and outright hatreds that have settled in as commonplace, the unmet crying need to work together to build and provide and to move forward all beg for our attention and assistance.

The prophet goes on to say of Christ that he is "just" and "meek." You and I, first and foremost, must be "just" enough to be servants of truthfulness in our words and "meek" enough to be balanced in our judgments. It is most needful in our day and age. That commitment to a truth greater than our own, or of our group's interest, can help us. It guarantees the justice and selfless service by which alone can our nation and world be restored and on the basis of which can we reliably continue to thrive.

In that hope, the readings this weekend invite us to realize the freedom of the children of God and the joy of living in the Spirit of God. We are to live not in the brokenness of worldly flesh (see Romans 8:9-13) nor in the strife, envy or conflict that it brings. Commitment to the truth of God's saving love for you, and the truth of how you are to love your neighbor in light of God's love, is the one force that sets you inwardly free.

These words from today's Gospel (see Matthew 11:25-30): "Take my yoke upon you and learn from me," are Jesus' invitation to learn from him how to live well, how to love well in accord with his example. By taking on the "yoke" we join our lives to Jesus. We learn from him to bear the "burden" of a total love of the Father. In and through Christ we begin to live a generous love of neighbor. In Jesus' Gospel, you can truly be free. The framers of the Declaration of Independence once wrote with deepest conviction: "And for the support of this Declaration, with a firm Reliance on the Protection of divine Providence, we mutually pledge to each other our Lives, our Fortunes, and our sacred Honor. You are invited by Jesus to come to him. You are invited by Jesus to pledge, in communion with him, your life, your fortune and your sacred honor to the utter importance of cultivating and growing strong in the demands of your relationship with God and neighbor as taught by him. Your mission in Christ is to reach out to brothers and sisters the world over, sharing with them the love you have discovered in Christ. Help them live well.

Comments from Deacon Joe

The Precious Blood of Christ

July is the Month of the Precious Blood The July 1 celebration of the Precious Blood was merged with the Solemnity of Corpus Christi to be the Solemnity of the Most Sacred Body and the Most Precious Blood of Christ. We read in the Bible



that there is no forgiveness of sin without the shedding of blood. Jesus shed his blood on the cross in the sacrifice which saves the whole world, so we say that his blood saves us https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Feast_of_the_Most_Precious_Blood.

Now that Jesus is risen, his body and blood, soul and divinity cannot be separated. If you receive the Body of Christ in the Host, you are also receiving his Blood; and if you receive the Blood of Christ from the chalice, you are also receiving his Body. But at the Last Supper, Jesus gave both to the apostles, and it better signifies the sacrament when we receive both. So I'm pleased that the Archdiocese has given permission for Communion under both species to resume.

Here at Star of the Sea Parish, to offer the cup at all Masses, we would need more ministers to staff the two additional Communion stations at each Mass. We'd want six more at 4:00, six at 7:30, eight at 9:00, and five at 11:00 in order to assign ministers once every three weeks. So if you'd like to be able to receive the Precious Blood of Christ from the cup, please consider volunteering to be a Communion Minister, and let Monsignor Moran or me know if you're willing.

Meanwhile, you might find it good to pray the Litany of the Precious Blood and reflect on the various titles given to the Precious Blood <u>https://www.usccb.org/prayers/litany-most-</u> precious-blood. **Rabbi David Meyer** has retired as Senior Rabbi at Temple Emanu-El and has become Rabbi Emeritus. I was happy to be able to attend his final Sabbath service as Senior Rabbi on June 30. It was a joyous event, followed by a groundbreaking for an outdoor sanctuary which is being created in his honor.



I met Rabbi Meyer when I became a deacon in 1996 and started attending meetings of the Marblehead Ministerial Association. He has always been calm, steady, thoughtful, knowledgeable, wise, friendly, and considerate. His presence has blessed the Association and Town in ways that have drawn believers together as people of faith and residents together as members of one community. It is good that he has decided to remain with us in Marblehead, allowing us to continue to benefit from his wisdom. Mazel tov, David, ad multos annos!

This week we have three obligatory memorials. The first is my personal favorite of the three: <u>St Benedict</u>, on July 11. He was the founder of Western monasticism. His "Rule for Monasteries" is the foundation for all communities of Benedictines. He teaches us to prefer nothing to the work of God and seek to golrify God in all things
