June 11, 2023 Corpus Christi, The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

Dear Parishioner of Our Lady Star of the Sea,

"Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him." This promise of the Lord from today's Gospel reading (see John 6:51-58) is a central aspect of our celebration of *Corpus Christi*, the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. Unlike the manna God gave to sustain his people in the wilderness as they fled from slavery in Egypt toward the promised land (see Deuteronomy 8:2-3; 14b-16a) but was not to be kept over, this Bread from Heaven given by Jesus is meant to remain, even its fragments gathered up. "The bread we break, is it not a <u>participation in the body</u> of Christ?" (see 1 Corinthians 10:16-17). These words indicate that we enter and remain in a communion of life, mind and heart with Jesus and with one another when we celebrate Eucharist and worthily receive the gift of Holy Communion.

The action of "eating" posed a problem for the initial hearers of Jesus' word. They asked "How can this man give us his flesh to eat?" Jesus' answer to them speaks more to the "why" of the gift than to the "how." We are to remain in him and he in us. The action of eating speaks to this in two ways. First, as those who receive this food from heaven, we are to receive it and make it a part of our own lives. We are not just to acknowledge the Gospel, and to have some contact, however fleeting, with the person and example of Jesus. No. We are to consume, we are to make entirely our own the gifts of his life and love. It should enter every fiber and aspect of our lives, bodily, spiritually and morally. Secondly, we are to be taken up and consumed into the mission of Christ himself. We enter and become a living part of his body, the Church, being taken up and transformed by his saving love. As to the "how," it is by Jesus' own word at the Supper, taken as he said it, and by the gift of God who nourishes and feeds us body, mind and soul in his providential love.

As Catholic Christians, we have a particular honor and respect for the wonders of this great Gift of the Eucharist. Our call is to make our own the Gospel of Christ, digesting its every aspect and incorporating it into our lives. Our mission is to be taken up by Christ and made the fulfillment of his promise to be present in our world until the end of time, transforming our human nature from within by remaking us in his image and likeness each day. Every bit as real as is that call and that mission, so too is the presence of Christ in the gifts of his Body and Blood "real" by every measure. All that Christ is, is given to us in Holy Communion. All that is in us is taken up by him and transformed into his living presence in and for the world.

This Solemnity of *Corpus Christi* is a good time to remind ourselves of the adoration and honor in which we hold and cherish this abiding Gift. Such respect is shown in making a visit to the Church, on your own, in quiet adoration of Christ before the tabernacle. There is no better place to pray than here in the "inner room" of your Father's house, praying "Our Father" united with Jesus, the beloved. This experience of prayer in communion with Jesus should well be a part of your daily routine. Our Church is open for prayer every day from 7:00 a.m. through 7:00 p.m. for you and for the Lord.

The Lord remains in, with and for us through the gift of the Eucharist; may we remain faithfully and lovingly with and in him.

Comments from Deacon Joe "Holibav Season" Continues

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Today is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ to give it its official title. With the liturgical revisions after Vatican II the feast of the Precious Blood of Christ (to which Pope St. John XXIII was particularly devoted) was merged into the long-standing feast of the Body of Christ (Corpus Christi in Latin), celebrated on the Thursday after Trinity Sunday. We celebrate the fact that at the Mass, in Holy Communion, Jesus gives us his own Body and Blood to sustain God's life of grace within us. As the saints remind us, we become what we eat in the sacrament. We are sanctified, or as the Christians of the East say, divinized. To foster awareness of the beauty and importance of the Lord's gift to us in the sacrament of the altar, our bishops have transferred the celebration to the Sunday after Trinity. https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Feast of Corpus Christi

The Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus is on the Friday after the Body and Blood of Christ. Here the focus is not on the sacramental presence of Jesus but on the loving mercy of God, symbolized by the Heart of Jesus. While God's universal and unconditional love could seem a bit abstract as a concept, we see that this love took flesh and was born of Mary. When we become aware of this personal love of Jesus, we can come to a love of God which "casts out fear." There is always a danger that awareness of our sinfulness could lead to fear of God as one who seeks to punish us. While

it is possible for us to reject God, the Sacred Heart teaches us to understand that God, in his love and mercy, is not looking to reject us but always to forgive and save. https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Sacred_Heart

This week in addition to the Solemnities we have two obligatory memorials. The day after the Solemnity of the Sacred heart we have the Memorial of the Immaculate Heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary. This year the date is June 17 In a way, this is a corollary of the Immaculate Conception. When we believe that Mary was conceived free from original sin and remained sinless by God's grace, it makes sense, in the context of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, to think of her heart as immaculate. Just as devotion to the Sacred Heart developed from devotion to the wounds he received at his crucifixion and death, so we think of the love of Mary as she stood by the cross, a love which mirrors that of Jesus. We celebrate Mary as Mother of the Church, and so we celebrate her love for us, symbolized by her Immaculate Heart. We can rely on her motherly love to make intercession with God for us. https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Immaculate Heart of Mary June 13 is the Memorial of St. Anthony of Padua, O.F.M., a doctor of the Church. He was from Lisbon, one of the early Franciscans and their first teacher of theology, a gifted preacher and writer. He died in 1321 and there is devotion to him as a helper in finding lost objects. https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Anthony_of_Padua
