March 10, 2024 Laetare Sunday ~ Fourth Sunday of Lent

Dear Parishioner of Our Lady Star of the Sea,

The half-way mark of our Lenten Journey having past this week, the liturgy bids us: "Rejoice!" This theme of the Fourth Sunday of Lent is one we can readily receive and participate in. It is the true meaning of our Lenten penances. We don't rejoice because penance is nearly over. We rejoice because joy is the fruit and the outcome of our prayer, our fasting and our works of charity. They cause us to rejoice.

Rejoicing is the goal of our life in Christ. The Gospel this weekend (see John 3:14-21) reminds us: "God so loved the world..." Jesus came to us that we might have life, that we might be saved, that we might believe. For by grace we have been saved through faith. "And this is not from you; it is the gift of God" (see St. Paul's Letter to the Ephesians 2:4-10). We are God's own handiwork, created in Christ Jesus for the good works that God has prepared in advance, that we should live in them.

The Gospel told us that the Son of Man was "lifted up" so that everyone who believes in him might have eternal life. You and I, through our prayer, fasting and works of charity are to "lift up" Jesus in our own day and in the sight of our world. We do so that they, too, might have life and have it to the full. As Paul reminds us, God has shown "the immeasurable riches of his grace in his kindness to us in Christ Jesus."

Because of God's love and kindness, our joy can be sincere and full. We, then, are to be instruments of a sincere and full joy in the hearts of our neighbors and friends. Cyrus of old Persia (see 2Chronicles 36:14 -16, 19-23) was an instrument of God's grace for his Chosen People's restoration and renewal. You are called to be an instrument of restoration and renewal in the context of our world today. The way to do so? Lift up Jesus in your prayer and in your style of generous detachment from the things of this life and thereby show your readiness to work in charity for the good of all.

Next Sunday will be our Commitment Sunday for our Annual Catholic Appeal. We are asked to take our rightful part in the work and ministry of our Church in the Boston area. Cardinal O'Malley depends on our participation and support to carry on his work as our Archbishop. Moreover, we are asked by the Gospel to "lift Up" Jesus in our words and actions each day, not only as individuals, but also as a community. Our Catholic Appeal helps us do just that! Please be generous in considering what you might be able to do. Each of us should take some share, however large or modest it might be, in the common work that is ours as God's people in this time and place.

Please remember our additional Confession times on Wednesday evenings in preparation for Easter and our celebrations of the Stations of the Cross each Friday evening during Lent.

Next Sunday we will also observe St. Patrick's Day with Irish Bread and celebrations at the Parish Center following the 9:00 a.m. Mass.




Comments from Deacon Joe



We're halfway through Lent on our way to Easter, and today is called *Lætare* Sunday, meaning "Rejoice Sunday." *Lætare* is the first word in Latin of the Entrance Antiphon for the Mass of the day. We rejoice especially today because we are halfway to Easter.

Do we need to refocus? Perhaps there is something we wanted to do but we've been inconsistent. If it's prayer, maybe it would help to set a (different) time for it rather than not having a set time or a time which isn't working. Similarly for almsgiving or charitable works. Perhaps we can do better if we set a specific or different time or place. If our fasting or giving up has been spotty, maybe adjusting mealtimes (e.g., when we have our major meal of the day) or tweaking our fast could help. Don't give up. There's still time, but be realistic.

Concert for Lent and Easter Next Sunday, March 17,



Matt Arnold will lead a Lenten concert featuring the oratorio "From Olivet to Calvary," by John Henry Maun-

der, published in 1904. I've never heard it, but I've seen the text, and it can be a good occasion for prayer as we hear in music about Jesus' entry into Jerusalem and several of the events of Holy Week, ending with his death on the cross. It includes some familiar hymns. I recommend it.

Home heat My furnace conked out on February 28

and the repairmen tried hard the next day but couldn't get the burner working properly. I needed to have the furnace and the hot water system replaced. The new system was installed over Monday and Tuesday, March 4 and 5. So I was without central heat for six days. The plumbers lent me four space heaters, which did a good job in the rooms where I had them. Without them I'd have been very uncomfort-



able. Now things seem to be back to normal with a new "tankless" system.

As it happens, a couple of weeks earlier I had booked a tour to Italy, which I probably would not have done if the business with the heating system had already happened. So maybe God made sure I got the money for the trip before I had the expense of the new heating system. At any rate, I'm grateful that I can take the trip, and I'm grateful that I have heat.
