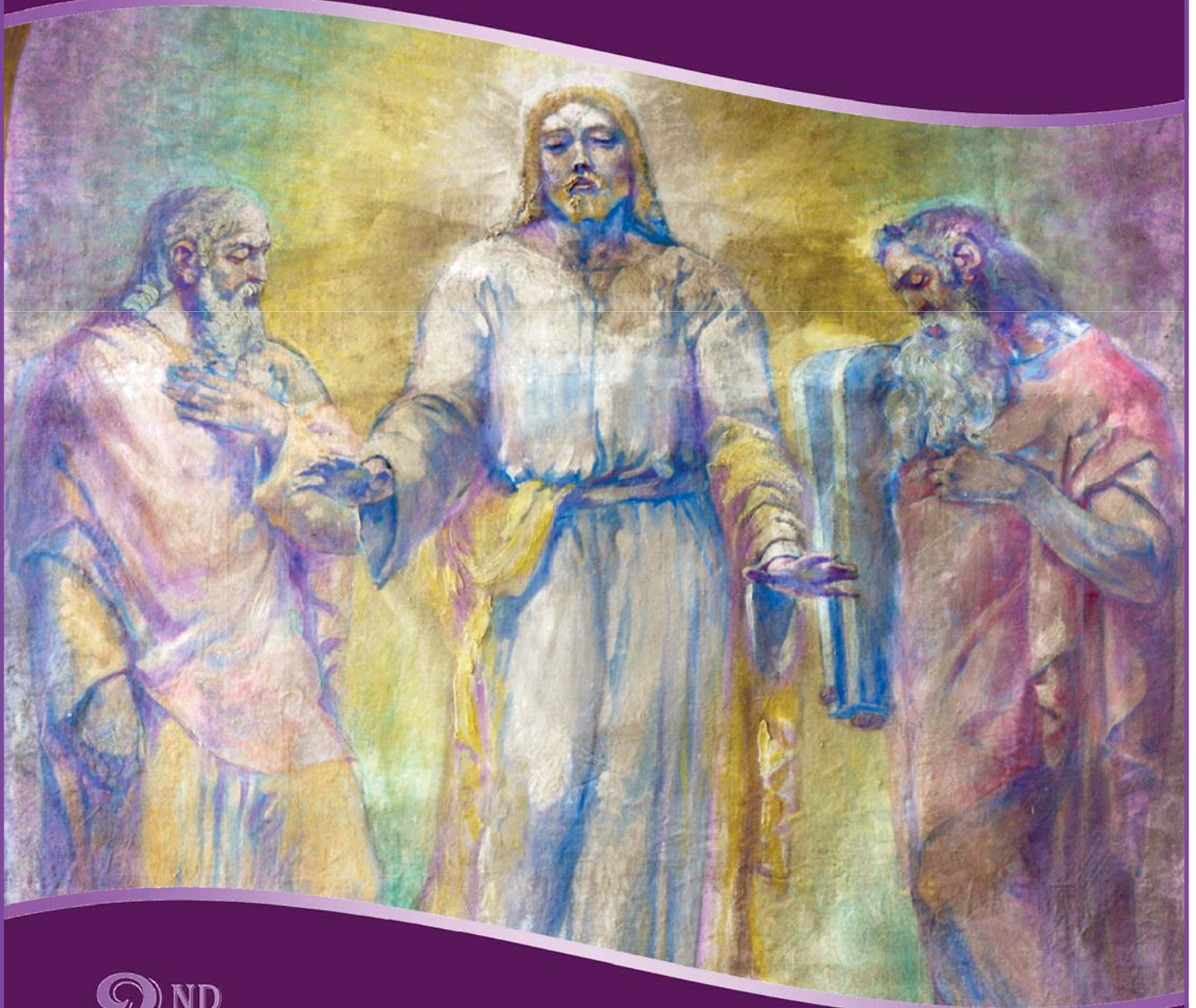

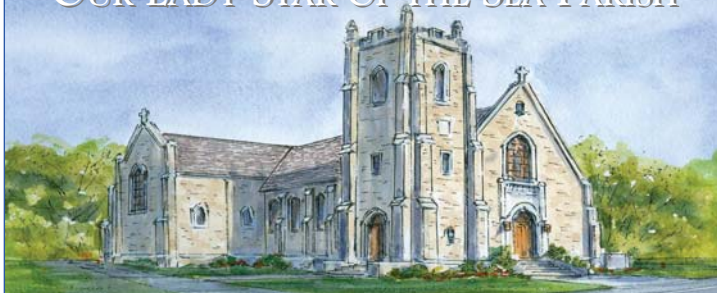

Second Sunday of Lent

Dear Parishioner of Our Lady Star of the Sea,

To pray is to touch the source of hope. "Jesus took Peter, John and James and went up the mountain to pray." These words of today's Gospel (see Luke 9:28b-36) introduce us to the theme of the transforming power of Jesus' prayer. In describing this scene, St. Luke does not use the verb "transfigured" as does Mark and Mathew. Luke does, however, emphasize the intimacy of the experience of these close friends. Luke describes the outward signs: their joint ascent, the Lord's face, his clothes, his company and his conversation. He describes the friends' deep sleep and their sudden awakening to see the Lord's glory. The scene culminates in the manifestation of God's voice identifying Jesus as the "Chosen Son," our Hope.

Luke associates it all with the Lord's praying. It is here, in the praying, that the whole point of our spiritual lives is revealed: a personal encounter with the Lord in prayer. Lifting our minds and hearts to God, we see our world and our selves through God's eyes, seeing everything anew, seeing everything with new hope. We are loved by God in and through Jesus. We are led by Jesus up and away from the deep darkness of the slavery of sin and fear of death that so dominate our human family's ways. We are led up the mountain by him to see and to hear for ourselves that at the center of reality we are not alone. There is One who seeks to speak with us. With eyes illumined by the light of this love, all the world seems new, hopeful.

This time of Lent is to be a time of such prayer. We understand from Jesus how prayer transforms, illumines. We see from Jesus that it is in the conversation which is prayer, guided by the Law, the Prophets and the Gospels prayerfully read, that we begin to understand the truth of God's love, the glory to which we are called and the true meaning of life itself. Together with Jesus in prayer, you and I begin to discern the voice of God telling us not only who Jesus really is as our Lord and Savior, but also the truth of who you and I are called to become in his love. In the words of St. Paul (see Philippians 3:17-4:1) Jesus "will change our lowly body to conform with his glorified body". By being "transfigured" by Christ in Gospel living we bring new light and new understanding to our world, fulfilling the promise once made to Abraham (see Genesis 15:5-12, 17-18) that God would one day "give you this land as a possession."

Our LENTEN SCRIPTURE STUDY this year will be a consideration of the 12th chapter of St. Paul's Letter to the Romans: "The Beauty of Christian Life." It will take place in two tracks, four Tuesday evenings at 7 or Wednesday afternoons at 1, beginning March 25th and 26th respectively. Be good to yourself and spend some time with God's Word! Please find, if you have not already done so, the flyers are at the doors of the Church inviting you to the Study and describing also other various opportunities in the Parish for Lenten renewal.

Many of our 10th and 9th grade members are preparing for Confirmation. I invite you to become a prayer partner with one or another of these students. Confirmation Prayer Partners slips are available at the front of the Church near the cross displayed by the Tabernacle. You are encouraged to pick a slip and to pray for that candidate during the final preparation for the Sacrament this Spring.

Asking God's blessing on you for a prayerful Lenten experience, I am

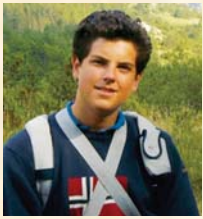

The Exhibition will open during our Thursday Eucharistic Exposition on May 8th

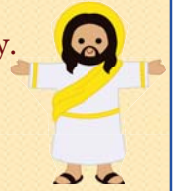

Comments from Deacon Joe

St. Joseph

In the early centuries of Christianity, not much attention was paid to St. Joseph. Although he is mentioned in the “infancy narratives” of the Gospels of Matthew and Luke, ending with the finding of thirteen-year-old Jesus in the Temple, the gospels do not record him as present for any of Jesus’ public ministry. It is widely assumed that he had died by then. But, in any case, his lack of presence in scripture contributed to his being largely ignored for centuries. Beyond that, the literally iconic moment for Joseph in scripture came to be the passage in the Gospel of Matthew which says that when Mary was found to be with child, “Joseph ... decided to divorce her quietly” (see Matthew 1:18). Iconographers subsequently ignored the rest of the passage, in which Joseph believes the truth then revealed to him and marries Mary, and they gave us icons showing Mary with the newborn Jesus in the cave at Bethlehem, with Joseph apart. In Nativity icons after the year 800, the Western Church, especially, began to recognize the important role that Joseph had in Jesus’ life, and devotion to him slowly grew. Western painters from the time of the Renaissance have showed him as fully present at the birth of Jesus and during his boyhood. Today, we recognize Joseph as an important saint, the protector and guardian of Jesus. In our church the window of the prophet Jeremiah shows St. Joseph over St. Peter’s Basilica and gives him the title “Universal Protector” of the Church.

We interrupt Lent with a solemnity in his honor on March 19, including special foods in many national traditions, and we pray for his intercession on behalf of children, families, and the Church. He is patron saint of fathers, carpenters, laborers, the dying, etc., and the Church https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Saint_Joseph.

Vernal Equinox. Spring begins astronomically when the sun appears to cross the equator from the southern to the northern hemisphere. This year it happens on March 20

at 5:01 a.m. As the sun gets higher in the sky we can look forward to warmer weather. As Gilbert put it in “The Mikado,” “The flowers that bloom in the spring (tra la) breathe promise of merry sunshine.” Enjoy the spring! <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=VBgUtXRc4sM>.

This week, the Feast of St. Patrick is celebrated on March 17. The precise dates of St. Patrick’s life are not known, but he was active in the 400’s. Born into a Christian family in Roman Britain, he was kidnapped and brought as a slave to Ireland. After six years he escaped and became a priest. His love for the pagan people of Ireland led him to return as a missionary. He traversed the island, spreading the faith everywhere, and is recognized as the Apostle of Ireland.

In the General Roman Calendar, his day, falling in Lent, is an optional memorial, but he is the principal patron saint of Ireland, so there the day is a solemnity and a holy day of obligation. Emigrants and missionaries from Ireland carried devotion to him to many lands and places, including Nigeria, where he is the country’s patron saint, and, of course, to America, where he is the patron saint of many dioceses, including Boston. Since he is our patron, March 17 ranks as a feast here. So if you are of Irish extraction or belong to the Archdiocese of Boston, you may wish to invoke his patronage at Mass that day, and perhaps celebrate it in other suitable ways. (Corned beef and cabbage, wearing of the green, anyone?) https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Saint_Patrick.
