

March 3, 2024 Third Sunday of Lent

Dear Parishioner of Our Lady Star of the Sea,

"Christ, the power of God and the wisdom of God" is at work drawing us into right relationship with the Father in whom we find our love, and with each other with whom we are called to share that same love (see 1 Corinthians 1:22-25). We celebrate his work during our Season of Lent. We seek to work together with our Lord and to his ends for our good and for the good of our world, that so much needs our sane and healthy presence.

The Gospel reading this Third Sunday of Lent (see John 2:13~25) places us before the figure of Jesus cleansing the Temple. The Temple is, first and foremost, a "house" in which we can be at home in a communion of mind and heart with the Father and, thereby, with each other. It is not to be a marketplace. Jesus drives out those who would make it a market, together with their animals, and removes the cages, tables and other items. Jesus does his cleansing with great energy, determination and zeal. "He made a whip out of cords and drove them all out of the temple area, with the sheep and oxen…"

As the passage will make clear, Jesus is speaking first and foremost of the temple that was his body. The "home" of God in our midst is not the building dedicated to God's honor, but the heart, mind and body of one in love with God. In Jesus, you and I are to be that home of God's grace in this world. The First Reading (see Exodus 20:1-17) calls us to respect the Words (Commandments) of God, Jesus' Father and ours. God's Ten Words were meant to lead us to everlasting life (see Psalm 19). Jesus fulfills the Commandments in his perfect love for his Father and in embracing, in love, the mortality of us all, his brothers and sisters, grimed by the ravages of sin. Jesus, in his person and by living example, continues his mission of cleansing our hearts as he recalls each of us and our Church community to the life of the Gospel and to the right set of priorities and truths that should guide our life and our witness before the world.

We, and our world, are not, ultimately, a marketplace. We are a communion of encounter with God and one another. Jesus continues his mission of cleansing the Temple as he calls us through this holy Season of Lent to renewal and reform in the light of the Gospel and to a clearer and more convincing witness before others of our true love and our true way of life and our true goal: home with God. You consecrate our parish church by your presence when you drop by during the week for a few moments of prayer with the Lord. Set aside the business of the day and spend a private period of time of enjoyment with the Lord. The Church is open for you each day from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.

This weekend is the kick-off for the 2024 Catholic Appeal: "Forward in Faith!" We hear from Cardinal O'Malley of the need for living our faith together. It is only by praying, working and living faith together that we can work towards meeting the needs of brothers and sisters, both known and unknown. The Annual Appeal supports all that the Archdiocese provides to our life of faith as a community. It makes our Faith Community an effective presence of God's goodness in our midst. I ask your generous response to the Cardinal's request. Our Parish goal this year is \$61,700. May we do all we can to take our share in this common work of the Church.

Before the Cross of Christ displayed in the Sanctuary, there are the names of our Confirmation Candidates who have begun their proximate preparation for the celebration of that sacrament this coming Fall. You are invited to take a name from the table and to make that person a remembrance in your prayer before God from now until their Confirmation.

Lenten Fasting and Abstinence

In Catholic practice, it is considered divine law that all Christian faithful do penance each in his or her own way (CIC 1249). Some common observances of penance are also proposed. The Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence from meat for those 14 years or older. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting in which one modest meal may be taken together with two other takings of solid food that do not add up to a meal, for ages 18 through 59.

Comments from Deacon Joe Third Sunday of Lent

How is Lent going? Remember that we can always review what we are doing for Lent. Are we doing what we planned? If not, should we try



harder, or were our plans unrealistic? The point is to actually do something, not to have big plans we can't keep. So we should be realistic, and adjust our prayer, fasting, or almsgiving if necessary. It's also possible that by now we can see that we could actually do more. If so, we can increase our Lenten activity. As with any decision, it makes sense to pray about it. Ask God, "What should I do now?"

Concert for Lent and Easter In two weeks, on March



17, Matt Arnold will lead a Lenten concert featuring the oratorio "From Olivet to Calvary," by John Henry Maunder, published in 1904. I've never heard it, but it

can be a good occasion for prayer as we hear in music about Jesus' entry into Jerusalem and several of the events of Holy Week, ending with his death on the cross. I recommend it.

Catholic Update This month's Catholic Update is now available. Titled "Anxiety and OCD: Integrating Treatment and Faith," it talks about normal worrying and unhealthy patterns of worry. The author, a Catholic psychologist recommends getting treatment for excessive anxiety, with pastoral



involvement. One form of unhealthy anxiety is scrupulosity, and a sidebar addresses it specifically.

This week there are four commemorations. They may be observed at Mass at the discretion of the celebrant:

St. Casimir, born in 1458, died in 1484. He was a prince of Poland and Lithuania, known for piety and charity. He is patron saint of both countries, and he is remembered on March 4, the date of his death https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Saint Casimir.





March 7 is the Commemoration of <u>Sts. Perpetua and Felicity</u>, a noblewoman and her pregnant slave who were martyred along with four men in Carthage in about 203 https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Perpetua and Felicity.

The next day, March 8, brings the Commemoration of St.

John of God, OH, the founder of the Order of Hospitallers. He was born in Portugal on March 8, 1495, and died on March 8, 1550, in Granada. He was canonized in 1690. After many years spent variously as a shepherd and a soldier, he underwent a conversion in 1537 and eventually found his vocation in caring

for the sick poor of Granada https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/John of God.

March 9 is the Commemoration of St. Frances of Rome,



O.S.B. She was married at an early age to a wealthy man and used the family wealth to care for the poor and sick. She became a Benedictine oblate and founded a community of oblates. She was born in 1384 and died on March 9, 1440. She was canonized in 1608 https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/

Frances of Rome.
