March 5, 2023 Second Sunday of Lent

Dear Parishioner of Our Lady Star of the Sea,

The voice from the cloud said: "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him!" (see Matthew 17:1-9). So begins our second week of Lenten journeying. The Gospel scene is of that moment when Jesus was on the mountain with his friends Peter, James and John, and in the presence of Moses and Elijah. The Transfiguration usually invites us to think of the Lord's coming passion, death and resurrection. The Law and the Prophets had foretold that through suffering would the Christ enter his glory. The moment of the transfiguration actually makes clear what is already the deepest truth about Jesus: The shining glory of the Father's love made flesh.

As with Peter, James and John, it is the communion of friendship that allows the deeper reality to be perceived. The Transfiguration is presented and perceived from the point of view of intimate friendship with Christ. The shining face of Jesus reveals what our humanity should look like as redeemed in the saving love of friendship with God and with each other in God. The Gospel helps us see our human nature in a new light: not as a "thing" but as a communion of life and love. Indeed, we are to see each other in a new light. Transformed by the grace of Christ and renewed in the power of the Holy Spirit you and I are called to shine with the very love of God.

Essential, then, to our Lenten journey is to learn to see each other as God sees us, by entering more deeply into the friendship with Christ to which we have been invited. We are to come to learn something of that specific love in which Christ holds each and every person in our life. We are asked to perceive the very love for which Christ gave his life. What does Jesus see that you and I often do not? The only way we can catch a glimpse of how God sees, and to begin to love as God loves, is by pursuing the way of friendship with Jesus each and every day.

How best to do that? The answer is given to Peter, James and John: "Listen to him." Jesus invited his friends to climb the mountain of transfiguration together with him. Jesus invites you and I to climb the mountain of Lenten penance: fasting, almsgiving and prayer. In these observances we, like people on a mountain, see the world and life from a whole new perspective. St. Paul tells Timothy (see 2 Timothy 1:8b–10) that according to God's own design that we are enlightened by "grace bestowed on us in Christ Jesus before time began, but now made manifest." What does that grace reveal in you and your loved ones? It is the fulfillment of the promise made to Abraham (see Genesis 12:1-4a) concerning our future in Christ: "You will be a blessing." The only way to perceive that blessing is from the heights of freedom from self-concerns and a renewed relationship with Jesus through fasting, almsgiving and prayer. The ways of Lent are first and foremost the deepening of our friendship with Jesus by walking with him each day and by following his ways.

Next weekend, the Catholic Appeal 2023 will begin in all parishes throughout the Archdiocese. In preparation, we invite you prayerfully to consider making a generous gift that will benefit both our parish and the many ministries that serve the parishes, schools, and communities throughout the Archdiocese. The Pope's Monthly Intentions 2023

March

For victims of abuse

We pray for those who have suffered harm from members of the Church; may they find within the Church herself a concrete response to their pain and suffering.

Comments from Deacon Joe Desiderio Desideravi

After reminding us of the importance of properly planned celebrations of the liturgy, Pope Francis next says that this must be at the service of our "Amazement before the Paschal Mystery: an essential part of the liturgical act." He is calling, not for some individualized feeling of reverence. The objective fact that what happens at Mass is Christ's giving himself to us to be consumed, so that he is united with each one of us in his saving action of giving his life on Calvary and rising on Easter

— this fact should be in our minds; and it is an "amazing grace." In other words, what happens at Mass is Christ reaching out to each person



in love and self giving. We must marvel "at the fact that the salvific plan of God has been revealed in the paschal deed of Jesus (cf. Eph 1:3-14), and the power of this paschal deed continues to reach us in the celebration of the 'mysteries,' of the sacraments." The liturgical reforms of the Second Vatican Council were designed to enable each of us live fully the meaning of the sacrament through the symbols which express it. One problem is that people are generally no longer as attuned to the meaning of symbols as in former times. Yet the capacity is still there to be developed. In light of this the pope asks, "How can we grow in our capacity to live in full the liturgical action? How do we continue to let ourselves be amazed at what happens in the celebration under our very eyes?" He says, "We are in need of a serious and dynamic liturgical formation."


Lenten Scripture Study Monsignor Moran will begin the scripture study this week, and I strongly recommend it. I've attended previous studies, and I can tell you that every session is packed with insights. Msgr. Moran shows deeper meanings of the texts and connections to the rest of the Bible.If you attend, your understanding will be deepened and you'll never read Exodus quite the same. You can just show up on Tuesday evening at 7:00 or Wednesday afternoon at 1:00, but if you call the rectory to let them know you'll be there, it helps Msgr. Moran know how many copies of the handouts to make.

This week the Memorial of St. Perpetua and Felicity is March 7. Perpetua was a noble lady with an infant son and Felicity her pregnant slave. Both were martyred, along with several others at Carthage in the year 203. There is a "prison journal" in which Perpetua describes her sufferings during her imprisonment prior to her martyrdom,
