

May 7, 2023 Fifth Sunday of Easter

Dear Parishioner of Our Lady Star of the Sea.

"Lord, let your mercy be on us, as we place our trust in you." These words of Psalm 33 capture well the prayer of our Easter Season and this Fifth Sunday of our celebrations. We trust that God's mercy will be upon us to guide and to strengthen us on our life's journey. By the power of that mercy by which Jesus freed us from sin and death and called us to new life in him, we can be sure that any challenge, any difficulty can be absolved and overcome. That is the basis of our trust as we hear Jesus say: "Do not let your hearts be troubled" (see John 14:1-12). In Jesus we have courage! We have faith in God and in his Son, Jesus, who is "the way and the truth and the life." We trust that Jesus will be present to us and with us, leading us along his "Way."

When Jesus invited his disciples at the Last Supper not to be "troubled" in heart, however, he was not speaking in general terms about worry or anxiety. He had something specific in mind. He had just said: "I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another. This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." That love in which Jesus lays down his life for our sake is the love we are to have with and for God and with and for one another. Can you love like that? Peter professes his readiness to lay down his life for Jesus. But Jesus warns him of his weakness and his impending triple denial. Alone he will fail. It is then that Jesus consoles: he does not want Peter or the disciples, or us, "troubled" in the realization of the weakness of our own love and life.

The "many dwelling places" in the Father's house are not a heavenly Condo Association of sorts. They refer to the many abiding dimensions of lasting love, the staggering breadth and depth of God's saving love. As Jesus "goes" to prepare these places for us he goes to his cross. He enters the heart of God's saving love, multiplied out for each and every sinful, fallen, mortal soul. Embracing that love, Jesus brings forgiveness and raises up all who are fallen, including me and you. Jesus offers an encouragement to Peter, to the disciples and to us: he will come back to take us with him. United with Jesus, following his way, we enter into the Father's love. With Jesus at our side, we dwell, abide in that love in which God sent his Son as our redeemer, the redeemer of all. We are enabled, then, to speak and to act thanks to his abiding presence and in our abiding faithfulness to his truth and to his life within us. With Peter, we learn the surety that Jesus' love does not condemn but saves and raises up.

We will schedule opportunities for general Parish meetings in the coming weeks, now that our community has truly begun to come alive again after our Covid-19 and other challenges. Together we will look at our pastoral and financial state of health. Together will set our next priorities for our mission and for the care and strengthening of our families and community. Together we place our trust in the Lord.

Wishing one and all a happy continued celebration of Easter, and renewing our prayers of blessing over our Mothers, both living and deceased, I am
