

# OUR LADY STAR OF THE SEA PARISH

Marblehead, Massachusetts

November 26, 2023 Solemnity of Christ the King

Dear Parishioner of Our Lady Star of the Sea,

"When the Son of Man comes in his glory..." These words from this weekend's Gospel (see Matthew 25:31-46) remind us that Jesus will return a Victor, with a kingship not of this world but of a "kingdom" prepared for you from the foundation of the world." The Universe of which Jesus is king is not measured by time, place or boundaries of either. This is a kingdom of God's own loved ones. This is a kingdom built of relationships. It is based on God's own love for each and every one he has created. This is a kingdom in which the Shepherd proclaims that the fullness of his intimate communion of love and life is given over to "one of the least brothers of mine."

We usually think of this Judgment scene as the final judgment of all humanity. A friend has recently pointed out to me that we should be more precise. This is the Judgment not of all but of those who have not known Jesus. Indeed, the first group, who helped those in need, clearly say that they never saw him. The second group protest that they, too, never saw him and would have ministered had they seen. The possibility of entering the kingdom depends on having done good for the least of humanity, thereby doing good for the Lord. Those who have not known Jesus do have hope for salvation if they have done good for the least. This is true not because of their doing, but because Jesus has, in love, embraced our humanity and, in greater love, has in the weakness of his passion and death won salvation.

Today's Solemnity of Christ the King invites us to contemplate our state in life when all has been said and done. We look upon our lives from the point of view of our relationship with Jesus. That is why each and every act of love, or neglect, of any little brother or sister is a privileged moment of engagement, or of tragic forgetfulness, in our relationship with God. Eternal Life is offered, according to the Gospel theme, not because you recognized the presence of God "in" the needy and poor. Rather, it is offered because you loved those needy and poor with the very same love in which God holds them. Such is the culmination of our growth in love with and for the Lord. When all is said and done, we love God by making our own God's love for all, great and small alike. May you and I live by such love each day.

We celebrated these past days our observance of Thanksgiving, "Heaven and earth are full" of God's glory, of that presence of Christ not only in moments we readily recognize as blessings, but throughout all our days. Even moments of needfulness that we do not readily welcome as blessings, are in fact blessings because Christ himself is especially present there. He loves us most deeply when we can say with him that we are "the least" of the company. All things are a blessing for those who learn to love as God does. If you learn to love as God does, you will become a blessing to all in and through all your loves.

Our final preparations are underway for our Christmas Fair Saturday, December 2nd. Please plan to join us. Raffle tickets are available after Masses this weekend as are tickets for the upcoming New England Brass Band Christmas Concert, a not-to-be-missed celebration.

# Comments from Deacon Joe Christ the King

We have arrived at the last week of Ordinary Time, beginning with today's Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, and next Sunday will be the First Sunday of Advent, the beginning of a new liturgical year. Calling Christ "King of Kings" goes back to the Bible, but today's feast was only established in the 1920's



by Pope Pius XI in response to the strife in the years following the end of World War I. He wrote that true peace would depend on Christ's reigning in human hearts. <a href="https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Christ the King">https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Christ the King</a>.

At baptisms, the newly baptized is anointed with sacred chrism with a prayer that he/she will live as a sharer in Jesus' roles of priest, prophet, and king. One aspect of the kingship which we share is when we make the world a better place by bringing God's love to others by our words and actions. That's the sort of non-political kingship Jesus already exercised during his ministry on Earth. But how do we share in his status of King of the Universe, which we are celebrating today? Thinking back to God's command to Adam and Eve to "fill the earth and subdue it," we can see our care for planet earth — called for once more by Pope Francis in "Laudato Si" — as our participation in Christ's universal kingship. Our parish's "Creation Care Team" is enthusiastically taking on that role, but we also do it whenever we do anything that benefits the environment.

This week the Feast of St. Andrew the Apostle is celebrated on November 30. He was the brother of St. Peter. After first encountering Jesus soon after his baptism, they were ultimately called to be his disciples when he encountered them at the Sea of Galilee while they were working as fishermen. Later, An-



drew was the one who told Jesus about the boy with the five loaves and two fishes which Jesus would use for the miraculous feeding of 5,000 people. Tradition indicates that he preached the gospel along the Black Sea and northward to the areas that are now Kyiv and Novgorod. Based on that, he is patron saint of Ukraine, Russia, and Romania. Finally he founded the Church of Byzantium (Constantinople). Thus the Ecumenical Patriarch of the Eastern Orthodox Churches is considered the successor of St. Andrew. He was martyred in the Greek city of Patras about the year 60 <a href="https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/">https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/</a> Andrew the Apostle.


