April 30, 2023 Fourth Sunday of Easter Good Shepherd Sunday

Dear Parishioner of Our Lady Star of the Sea,

"I came so that they might have life and have it more abundantly" (see John 10:1-10). These words of Jesus form the heart of our prayer this weekend. Jesus is, as Peter says (see 1Pt 2:20b-25): "The shepherd and guardian of your souls."

So that Jesus might bring you abundant life, and so that he might shepherd and guard your soul, Jesus enters your "sheepfold through the gate." Unlike the thief who "come only to steal and slaughter and destroy," Jesus, our Good Shepherd, comes directly to the gate, the main door of your mind and heart. He calls you to think. He calls you to choose. He calls each of you by name.

What a wonderful way to describe the work of God's grace for us. Jesus speaks to us directly, simply, freely. He speaks the word of truth. He speaks to the heart and soul in a freeing way that helps you welcome and recognize his voice and the abundant life to which he calls you.

This is totally unlike the more insidious, tortured, crooked, half-truths and misleads of many other voices that clamor for your attention. Our society today is endangered seriously by such voices. They seek to "climb over elsewhere" and are thieves and robbers. Just consider the "news" and the battle to partisan your support by whatever means necessary so someone else might gain position or power. These voices break into your mind and soul any way they can in order to gain advantage. put you off your way, and entice you to support plans and endeavors that do not lead to life. Do not follow such a stranger.

This Good Shepherd Sunday, ask for the grace that your heart respond readily and freely to the beauty of good living to which the Gospels call you. As Peter proclaims the Gospel (see Acts 2:14a, 36-41), he does so in just that way. The thousands of voices in Jerusalem who once called for Jesus' crucifixion are now the first thousands of voices who proclaim Jesus and freely choose to follow him, the Shepherd and Guardian of their souls. Jesus speaks to your heart and calls you to new life in him, whatever your past, whatever your problems have been. Listen to him, and live!

During this coming May, I will schedule opportunities for general Parish meetings, now that our community has truly begun to come alive again after our Covid-19 and other challenges. Together we will look at our pastoral and financial state of health. Together will set our next priorities for our mission and for the care and strengthening of our families and community.

### **Comments from Deacon Joe** Eastertide Continues

"The Jews" During Holy Week we hear the gospel accounts of the passion and death of Jesus. They contain references to "the Jews" as calling for the death of Jesus. When we hear these things, we need to remember that at the time of Jesus, there were several different factions within the Jewish people: Pharisees, Sadducees, Essenes, Zealots, and probably many ordinary people who didn't belong to any of these parties. In this light, the Second Vatican Council declared, True, the Jewish authorities and those who followed their lead pressed for the death of Christ;(13) still, what happened in His passion cannot be charged against all the Jews, without distinction, then alive, nor against the Jews of today. Although the Church is the new people of God, the Jews should not be presented as rejected or accursed by God, as if this followed from the Holy Scriptures."- Declaration on ... Non-Christian Religions §4

When we hear or read in the scriptures about "the Jews" as opposing Christ, we need to remember that these words are a kind of shorthand for the small element who actually were his opponents on that occasion. We should also realize that the gospels were written down at a later time when Jews who accepted Jesus, such as the apostles and many of their converts, had come under increasing pressure and persecution from other Jews who did not believe in him. The Temple had been destroyed, and Christian Jews were often unwelcome in the synagogues of non-Christian Jews.

It is unfortunate that in everyday speech, "the Jews" is understood to mean everybody of Jewish faith or ethnicity. Because of that, some people misunderstand these gospel texts as a justification for antisemitism. At a time when antisemitism is increasing, I'm always a little uncomfortable reading these texts at Mass for fear that some hearers will misunderstand them. We need to be clear on what they mean and what they don't mean so that they don't foster prejudice.

My trip last Monday to St. Anselm College to be present at the awarding of the first John S. Whipple Scholarship in Eighteenth Century Studies went very well. I had an enjoyable three hours on campus, which included reading a sonnet of Shakespeare and meeting the winner of the scholarship and two other applicants. The winner was Jillian Dorazio, whose topic is "The Paradox of 18th Century Enlightenment: A History of Western Racism." She

suggests that, "Enlightenment thinking has also provided the foundation for a racial taxonomy that seeps into the current age." So she will be looking deeply into the writings of 18th Century philosophers to see how they may have Dr. Favazza &



influenced later generations. It is appropriate that the first "Whipple scholar," chosen by a panel of St. A faculty, is continuing the "ferment of ideas" which is what my dad admired about the 18th Century.

This week Monday is the optional memorial of St. Joseph the Worker, which calls us all to be aware of the dignity of work, especially manual labor, and to support the right of all workers to be fairly compensated for their work with a living wage. www.franciscanmedia.org/saint-of -the-day/saint-joseph-the-worker/

Tuesday May 2 brings the Memorial of St. Athanasius, the tireless defender of the divinity of Christ against the Arian heresy in the 4th Century. We must continue to understand that Jesus is fully God as well as fully human.
