

February 19, 2023 Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Parishioner of Our Lady Star of the Sea,

The Sermon of the Mount continues as the source of our prayer this weekend (see Matthew 5:38-48). It proffers a particularly high, seemingly impossible, command: "So be perfect, just as your heavenly Father is perfect." This teaching echoes what we hear in the First Reading (see Leviticus 19:1-2,17-18): "Be holy, for I, the LORD, your God, am holy." We who take the teaching of Jesus seriously, as we certainly strive to do, know that we are neither perfect nor perfectly holy. I know that I cannot make myself perfect by my own doings. And I also know that my holiness is not on the level of that of God. In the midst of such an impasse, we turn to the wisdom of St. Paul (see 1 Corinthians 3:16-23). The perfection that the Gospel calls us to realize, and the holiness that we are invited to live, are not our wisdom nor our accomplishment. Indeed, even the greatest wisdom of this world, Paul says, "is foolishness in the eyes of God." Our perfection, our holiness is not our own; it is the perfection and holiness of God's love over us. It is, as St. Paul says, the fact that "you belong to Christ, and Christ to God." When we hear the command of Christ to "be perfect," he is inviting us to be perfected in a love greater than ourselves, God's love. When the Law of Moses commanded the people to "be holy," is was an invitation to be made holy by the saving love of God. The perfect love that is in God has been poured forth on us through Christ Jesus. The perfection in us is the perfect love in which God holds us. We are remade in the pattern of that love.

And yet, we are not mere recipients in all this. Jesus tells us: "offer no resistance to one who is evil." Jesus tells us: "love your enemies." Jesus tells us about strikes on the cheek, theft of our tunic, imposed service over the miles. These images all are presented in anticipation of the Lord's passion and death in which he showed what perfect love, what the holiness of God's love, truly looks and sounds like. We, then, are invited by Jesus to take up our cross and follow him, echoing his words and ways of perfect love. If we were to return evil for evil, or were to seek revenge for hurts suffered, what good would we have accomplished? We would be slaves of the evil one who harms us, being motivated, guided and ensnared by his misdeeds. Draw strength from the perfect love of God in us. Freely choose to pray, to forgive, to love without the other deserving it. So do we achieve true perfection and true freedom of love and life in lived communion with Jesus.

Many of you have recently received a letter or email from Cardinal O'Malley requesting your early support of the 2023 Catholic Appeal. These old palms are burned to produce the ashes that will be imposed on Wednesday, February 22nd. Comments from Deacon Joe Victims' Rights

A couple of weeks ago I saw a news story about a proposal to change the law in Florida because a jury had not imposed the death penalty on the Parkland High School murderer. The proposal was to reduce the number of jurors who would be needed to vote for the penalty. The concept of victims' fights was invoked in favor of the change.

Regardless of how you feel in general about whether victims of crimes should have a say in the sentence, and regardless of what the law allows, it strikes me that asking for heavy sentences is not something

Christians should do. In today's gospel Jesus tells us, "Turn the other cheek," and, "Love your enemies." This seems to me to be the opposite of using the workings of the criminal justice system to get our personal revenge for evils we have suffered. Certainly, criminals should receive a just sentence for their crimes, but if we are the victims, asking the courts to impose a heavier sentence than they might otherwise doesn't strike me as turning the other cheek. Giving a victim's impact statement so the court knows how serious the crime was can be useful for civil justice, but that seems different from going a step further and directly asking for a heavy sentence.

<u>Lent begins on Wednesday.</u> There's still time to decide what you will do for extra prayer (paying attention to God), fasting (giving up something), and almsgiving (helping people in need).



This week The <u>Feast of the Chair of the Apostle Peter</u>, which is February 22, is not celebrated this year because it's Ash Wednesday, which takes precedence. Thursday, February 23, is the Memorial of the martyr <u>St. Polycarp</u>. He was bishop of Smyrna

(now called Izmir in Turkey), one of the generation who received the gospel from the apostles. He was martyred at the age of 86 in the year 155. https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Polycarp


