June 4, 2023 Trinity Sunday

Dear Parishioner of Our Lady Star of the Sea,

The Church celebrates this weekend Trinity Sunday. The feast follows upon Pentecost Sunday by design. The Holy Spirit reveals, to us and in us, the full truth of God's life as One God in three Divine Persons. It was the indwelling of God's own Spirit in the minds and hearts of the faithful disciples that brought them to the full recognition of who Jesus is as the eternal Son of the eternal Father. And it is in knowing Jesus in the fullness of his love that we come to know the Father in the full reality of the Father's merciful love for the world. We rejoice in gifts of eternal life: in the Holy Spirit we come to know the one true God and Jesus Christ whom he has sent. Reality is a communion of love; a communion of relationship into which we have been invited.

In today's First Reading (see Exodus 34:4b~6,7~8) we are told of Moses prayer to God: "do come along in our company." God is the "merciful and gracious God, slow to anger and rich in kindness and fidelity" who walks with us and we with him. We do not know God chiefly by what is "said" about him, but through walking with God who accomplishes and realizes in the substance of our life as his people and in the life of each of us as his beloved, the kindness and fidelity that are his.

"That the world might be saved." This famous phrase (see John 3:16ff) gives expression to the motivation of Jesus' love and the purpose of his mission among us. He came not to condemn but to save and to raise up. Jesus faithfully enacts the love he knows: the inner life of God who is such love as to have sent his Son as man to save fallen humanity. Jesus matches the same love as he fulfills the mission given to him and hands over the Spirit from the loving heights of his cross.

We come to know a "fellowship of the Holy Spirit" (see 2 Cor 13:11-13) each with God and all for each in God. We seek to learn from the core identity of God, a trinity of persons yet one God, that the very foundation of reality as we know and experience it is rooted in the shared life, the shared love that is God. Because of that, we commit ourselves with St. Paul (see 2 Corinthians 13:11-13) to reflect the love and life of God in all our relationships: "mend... encourage... agree... live in peace.. be with... [and] greet one another." It is only when we learn to reflect something of the inner life of God and of his love that we cease being "a stiff-necked people" (see Exodus 34:4b-6; 8-9) and truly become those who say to God "receive us as your own."

We are to "walk" in God's company: fostering a real and lived communion of love and life among all peoples as children of one heavenly Father. We are to "save" as did Jesus, in a communion of life and love with him. The explosion of rage in our internet communications and across our society over these past decades feeds the beast of evil that manifests itself in the violence, injustice, prejudice and exclusions that recur. Pray God we do not add to the rage. Place your hope squarely in the kindness and fidelity of Christ. Rise thereby victorious over the wreck that sin has brought upon our world. Walk in God's own way. Raise up the world with Jesus through the witness of a mercy and kindness like his, unshaken. Prefer his love to the world's hate. Secure respect, justice and peace each with God and all for each in God.



The mystery of the Holy Trinity is the central mystery of the Christian faith and life. God reveals himself as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The doctrine of the Trinity includes three truths of faith.

- 1 The Trinity is One. We do not speak of three gods but of one God. Each of the Persons is fully God. They are a unity of Persons in one divine nature.
- **2** The Divine Persons are distinct from each other. Father, Son, and Spirit are not three appearances or modes of God, but three identifiable persons, each fully God in a way distinct from the others.
- 3 The Divine Persons are in relation to each other. The distinction of each is understood only in reference to the others. The Father cannot be the Father without the Son, nor the Son be the Son without the Father. The Holy Spirit is related to the Father and the Son who both send him forth. All Christians are baptized in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. The Trinity illumines all the other mysteries of faith.

Today is Trinity Sunday One of the priests who was assigned here 50ish years ago, Father James Whittier, used to read the Athanasian Creed as his homily on Trinity Sunday. St. Athanasius was a staunch defender of the doctrine of the Trinity and this creed explains it in precise theological terms. We should realize that the full truth about God isn't something our limited human minds can grasp, but we can say things that are true, as far as they go, and we can say that other statements aren't true. You may want to read and pray the Athanasian Creed for some insight into the mystery. Here's a link.

The Body and Blood of Our Lord is the title of next Sunday's solemnity. In many countries it's a Holy Day of Obligation celebrated on the Thursday after Trinity Sunday, but in the U.S. and some other places the observance has been moved to the following Sunday. The book Jesus and the Jewish Roots of the Eucharist is an excellent exploration of the meaning of the sacrament of Our Lord's Body and Blood. It "sold out" when we made it available (free) during Holy Week and Easter, so we've ordered more copies, which we hope will arrive by next Sunday. If you didn't get a copy last time, here's another chance.



Catholic Update for June is titled "Holy Communion: Who is Invited?" It approaches the topic of the Eucharist from a different angle from the book. It discusses the differing eligibility of Catholics and non-Catholics (in special

circumstances) to receive the sacrament as well as what is needed for a Catholic to receive the sacrament

worthily. It's now available.

This week the Memorial of St. Boniface, O.S.B., is June 5. Boniface was an English monk who became a missionary to Germany. He was made an archbishop and founded the archdiocese of Mainz as well as supporting the Abbey of Fulda. He preached the Gospel widely and was martyred with thirty companions in the year 754. He is called the "Apostle of
